He added that \$500.00 of this balance would be added to the 1970 Children's book budget and that some of the balance might be used to visit other libraries if the Library Bond passes. Skipper Williams moved and Jean Ulmer seconded that the 1969 annual report be accepted. The motion carried.

Jean Ulmer moved and Skipper Williams seconded that the Board retain Wayne Mayo for the year 1970 and commend him for his work in 1969. The motion carried.

Skipper Williams moved and Clark Coan seconded that the present slate of officers: Max Stalcup, Chairman; Jean Ulmer, Vice-Chairman; and Barbara Crews, Secretary-Treasurer, be retained for the next year. The motion carried.

REGULAR MEETING FOR FEBRUARY, 1970

The Board of Trustees of the Lawrence Public Library held its regular meeting at 4;30 p.m. Tuesday, February 10, 1970, in the Board Room of the Library.

Members present were: Chairman Max Stalcup, Clark Coan, Skipper Williams, and Jean Ulmer. Observer from the League of Women Voters: Mrs. H. V. Sanders.

The minutes of the December meeting had been previously sent to the Board members and were approved. Skipper Williams suggested that Mr. Mayo check to see if the January minutes are legal.

The Librarian gave the following statistics in his report:

Mr. Mayo and the Board discussed the financial report for January, 1970. Mr. Mayo explained that we got a large portion of our city tax funds very early this year. There was some discussion as to why library money cannot be invested. Mr. Mayo added that this may become possible in 1972 when we become a Library District. It was also discussed whether library money should be revolved to different banks every few years. No decision was made.

Max Stalcup appointed the following members to the Budget and Salary Committee for 1971: Clark Coan, Chairman; Larry Flannery and Skipper Williams.

Mr. Mayo told the Board that 1500 books had been moved to the Water Plant for storage but were still included in the book stock count. In reply to Jean Ulmer's question he stated that the DAR books are now stored at the Douglas County State Bank.

Mr. Mayo reported that he had conducted interviews in Denver and Oklahoma and written letters elsewhere in search of a Children's Librarian. He will go to Emporia March 10 and 11 to interview people there. If no one can be found to fill this position soon he suggested that the Board consider Mrs. Mary Paretsky for the position.

Mr. Mayo said that Shirley Williamson, a new employee, is now working in the Adult Circulation Department. Wilma Simmons moved from the Children's Room to part-time work on the Adult Circulation desk. Henriette Lundquist moved from Adult Circulation to the Children's Room.

Mr. Mayo reported that 600 Children's books have been loaned to the East Lawrence Community Center. The city provided the shelving. About 50 of these

books will be changed each month. The Center will report on the circulation and use of these books and Mr. Mayo will forward this information to the Board.
Mr. Stalcup suggested that the Ballard Center prepare the same type of report each month. Mr. Mayo said that this would be almost impossible because the Ballard Center has books other than those loaned to them by the Library.

Max Stalcup commended the campaign committee on their dedication and work. He said that he felt that the speeches had been well received. Mrs. Ulmer suggested that Thank You letters be sent to the committee and helpers whether the Bond Issue passes or not. Everyone agreed.

Mr. Mayo reported that he had checked on the price of a projector to be used in conjunction with the Children's Story Hour. Most of them fall in the range of \$160-\$175. He said that the one he preferred is made by Bell and Howell. Further discussion was postponed until the March meeting.

Bills amounting to \$14,527.27 were allowed by roll call.

The meeting was adjourned.

March 10, 1970

The Board of Directors of the Lawrence Free Public Library held its regular meeting on March 10 at 4:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Library.

Members present were: Chairman Max Stalcup, Larry Flannery, Clark Coan, Jean Ulmer, Barbara Crews and Skipper Williams. Observer from the League of Women Voters: Mrs. H. U. Sanders. There were several visitors from the City Commission including Mayor Clark Morton, City Clerk Vera Mercer, Asst. City Manager Dennis Kallsen, James Black, J. R. Pulliam and John Emick. Representatives of the press were Jerry Schwartz and Ed Myers. Architect Don Robertson was also a visitor.

The meeting was called to order. The members of the Commission explained the sale of the Library Bonds and the purchase of the proposed site. Mayor Morton also explained the process of condemnation. They said it will probably be June 1 before the property is acquired. They also said that they will apply the sale of the Library's current site to the bonded indebtedness.

Don Robertson stated that he should have the schematic designs and program ready in about six weeks. The estimated completion date for the new Library is October or November, 1971.

The Board thanked the City Commission for their help and said they would notify the Commission each time that they or the Building Committee meet with the architect. Mayor Morton commended the Library Board for their work and stated that he will keep us advised on the progress of the sale of the bonds and the acquisition of the site. He said that they would know more about it by the time of the next meeting.

Clark Coan moved that future regular meetings be held on the third Tuesday of each month at the regular time and place. Skipper Williams seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

The February minutes which had previously been sent to the Board were approved.

Mr. Mayo gave the financial report and Librarian's report. The statistics for February were as follows:

Mr. Mayo reported that he would be going to Emporia on March 11 to interview June graduates of the KSTC Library School. In answer to Larry Flannery's question, he said that some of the present Library equipment and shelving will be used in the new building. He said that the Board table and chairs will probably be refinished and used in the new library.

There was discussion about Clarence Paine, the Library Consultant. Mr. Mayo said that a consultant fee was included in Don Robertson's budget for the new library.

Skipper Williams stated that Don Robertson would be going to visit other new libraries in the state. Mr. Mayo said he felt that a Board member should try to go with Mr. Robertson when he makes these visits.

Mr. Mayo explained that there will not be much dead space in the new library. He also reported that he had called the State Library about Federal funds for the project. The State Library was not sure at the present time that any funds will be available.

The purchase of a filmstrip projector for the Library was discussed. Mr. Mayo said that it would be used for the Story Hour. He also said that it might be possible to loan it to other groups and organizations when it is not in use at the library. Larry Flannery moved that the Library purchase a Bell & Howell filmstrip projector at a cost of \$185.20. Jean Ulmer seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

It was decided that Mr. Stalcup would send thank-you letters to the Library Bond Campaign Committee.

Mrs. Ulmer had collected many articles about the Bond Campaign and she presented these to Mr. Mayo for use in the publicity scrapbook he is making.

Bills totaling \$10,711.18 were allowed by roll call.

The meeting was adjourned.

April 21, 1970

The Board of Directors of the Lawrence Free Public Library held its regular meeting on April 21 at 4:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Library.

Members present were: Vice-Chairman Jean Ulmer, Clark Coan, Larry Flannery, James Drury and Skipper Williams.

The Building Committee had met with the architects at 3:00 p.m. on April 21. Their report was as follows: The Library Bonds sold at 5.67%. The city is going to offer the appraised price of \$240,000 to the site owners. If within two weeks all have not accepted the land will be condemned. The architects had presented some preliminary drawings and stated that they still plan to break ground in October or November of 1970.

The March minutes which had previously been sent to the Board were approved.

James Drury thanked the Board for changing the regular meeting date.

Mr. Mayo gave the financial report and Librarian's report. The statistics for March were as follows:

Mr. Mayo stated that the Library will be closed Mayll so that the staff can attend Kansas Library Association meetings in Topeka. He also invited the Board to the staff picnic Sunday, May 17 in Centennial Park from 4:00p.m. to 7:00 p.m. He then explained about the Library's electricity rate increase. He said that he has catalogues of library furniture that the Board are welcome to look through at any time.

Mrs. Ulmer asked if there was to be any answer made to the questions that have arisen about the new library site. The Board discussed it and decided to forego making an answer. They felt that the site was clearly understood by all at the time of the election.

Mr. Mayo reported that he had been unable to find someone to fill the position of Childrens Librarian. He asked the Board to name Mary Paretsky as Acting Childrens Librarian with the understanding that he will not be actively looking for someone to replace her. He also asked them to raise her salary from \$4,500 to \$5,000 annually.

Larry Flannery moved that the Board approve Mr. Mayo's proposal. Clark Coan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Mrs. Ulmer gave an accounting of the private fund for illnesses. Clark Coan suggested that Mrs. Ulmer's successor take over the job of administering this fund.

The Budget Committee reported that it had met with Mr. Mayo on Friday, April 17. Copies of their proposed budget for 1971 had been sent to the Board prior to the Board meeting.

James Drury moved that the Board accept the proposed budget. Skipper Williams seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Larry Flannery suggested that a projected operating cost for the new building be prepared. Mr. Mayo said that a projection would be made.

James Drury mentioned that he is opposed to the library becoming a tax body. Larry Flannery requested that he present his viewpoint to the Board at the next meeting.

Mr. Mayo reported that the city wants the Library to apply for the Federal funds for the new library.

James Drury moved that the Chairman of the Board and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Board be authorized to apply for these funds. Clark Coan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Mr. Mayo explained the limitations that will be imposed by the state if the funds are approved for Lawrence. The city will administer the funds.

Bills totalling \$14,865.17 were approved by roll call.

Skipper Williams that he wanted the minutes to reflect the appreciation of the Board for the work of Jean Ulmer during her terms as a Board member.

Clark Coan moved that the meeting adjourn. Skipper Williams seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

The Building Committee had met with the architects at 3:00p.m. The Board talked with the architects before the regular meeting so no report was made.

The April minutes which had been previously sent to the Board were approved.

The first item of business was the election of a vice-chairman. Larry Flannery nominated Clark Coan. There were no further nominations. The vote was unanimous.

Mr. Mayo gave the Financial Report and the Librarian's Report. The statistics for April were as follows.

Mr. Mayo stated that he still had Mrs. Ulmer's gift book from the Board. Larry Flannery suggested that her dinner be rescheduled for May 26 at 7:00 p.m. Everyone agreed that the date was all right and Mr. Stalcup asked Mr. Mayo and Mrs. Walczak to take care of the details.

Mr. Mayo reported that the Library's application for Federal funds had gone in. He also noted that the Children's summer reading program would start on June 1.

Mr. Mayo read Law KSA 12-1215. Dr. Drury then stated his objections to the Library becoming a separate taxing unit. Discussion followed. The Board decided that they should talk with Mayor Metzler and City Manager Watson about it.

Mr. Mayo presented some preliminary estimates for operating costs in the new building. His figure was from \$28,000 to \$36,000. Larry Flannery suggested that we talk to other libraries about the increase in their operating costs in a new building.

Mr. Mayo requested that the Board purchase a new Royal manual typewriter with a card platen for the Library. He presented a bid from Lawrence Typewriter for \$198.30. (\$243.30 - tradein of 45.00) Clark Coan moved that the Board okay the purchase. There was no second. The Board decided that Mr. Mayo should get another bid.

Larry Flannery moved that Mr. Mayo attend the ALA meetings in Detroit at the expense of the Library. Dr. Drury seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Bills totalling \$10,742.98 were allowed by roll call.

Mr. Stalcup said that someone from O. E. O. had talked with him about placing someone in the Library. He told Mr. Mayo that he would send the representative down to talk with him.

The meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Trustees of the Lawrence Free Public Library held its regular meeting on Tuesday, June 16, at 4:00 p.m. in the Director's Room of the Library.

Members present were: Chairman Max Stalcup, Larry Flannery, Clark Coan, James Drury and new member, Alversa Milan. Mrs. Milan replaced Jean Ulmer whose term expired April 30, 1970. Observer from the League of Women Voters: Mrs. Evelyn Hastings.

The minutes of the May meeting had previously been sent to all Board members. Mr. Mayo made one correction. He stated that he had erred when he quoted the estimate on a new Royal manual typewriter from Lawrence Typewriter. The net figure should be \$208.30 instead of \$198.30 as stated in the minutes. James Drury moved that the minutes be approved with the one change. Larry Flannery seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Mr. Mayo gave the Financial Report and the Librarian's Report. The statistics for May were as follows.

Mr. Mayo informed the Board that the Library is now paying electric bills at the new higher rate. This will deplete the 1970 utilities budget rather rapidly as the new rate was not anticipated.

Mr. Mayo said that he had received a letter early in June stating that the Federal funds for library construction had been awarded to Newton, Kansas. The letter also stated that a fair hearing was to be held on June 8, 1970. The letter also stated that a fair hearing was to be held on June 8, 1970. Mr. Mayo, a representative from the city of Lawrence and several representatives from the Northeast Kansas Library System went to Topeka on June 8 to appeal the from the Northeast Kansas Library System went to Topeka on June 8 to appeal the decision. Representatives from Newton, Phillipsburg and McPherson, Kansas were also there. After the hearing the decision was reversed and the funds were awarded to Lawrence. He stated that the next step is for the Board to sign the contract with the state.

The Board discussed the signing of the contract. They agreed that the bonded indebtedness should be reduced by the amount of Federal funds received. Mr. Flannery suggested that someone from the Board talk with the city about the sale of the present library and its site. The Board had understood that the sale of the current site or building would also reduce the bonds.

James Drury moved that the Chairman and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Library Board be authorized to sign the contract for Federal Funds. Clark Coan seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Page 2 Minutes of Regular Meeting June 16, 1970

Mr. Stalcup stated that he would not sign the contract unless the city of Lawrence agreed to reduce the bonded indebtedness by the amount of funds received. He said he would notify the Board if they couldn't reach an agreement.

Mr. Mayo said that he had received a letter from Salina about possible operating costs increases in a new building. The Librarian from Salina stated that they had a \$17,000-20,000 increase in operating costs when they moved into their new building. Based on these figures Mr. Mayo thought Lawrence might experience a \$23,000-26,000 increase in operating costs upon opening the new building. This figure did not include a sinking fund for carpeting and an air conditioner compressor which had been discussed at the previous meeting.

The Board explained the population and tax law to the new member, Mrs. Milan. Lawrence has exceeded 35,000 population according to preliminary census figures. Discussion followed about the possibility of becoming a separate taxing unit in 1972. No decision was made.

Mr. Mayo stated that he had received a second bid on a new Royal manual typewriter for the Library. The bid from Lawrence Typewriter was \$208.30. The bid from the Royal outlet in Topeka was \$206.30. He said he felt that the Library would receive much better service if they purchased the typewriter in Lawrence.

Larry Flannery moved that the Library purchase the typewriter from Lawrence Typewriter at \$208.30. James Drury seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

Bills totalling \$11,321.40 were allowed by roll call.

The architects met with the entire Board at 5:20 p.m. following the regular meeting. They presented the Board their plans as of June 16 and also showed them a scale model of the proposed building.

Clark Coan moved that the Board approve the schematic design phase of the architect's program as of June, 16, 1970. Larry Flannery seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous.

The meeting was adjourned.

The Board of Directors of the Lawrence Free Public Library held its regular meeting on November 17 at 4:00 p.m. in the Board Room of the Library.

Members present were: Chairman Max Stalcup, Larry Flannery, Gene Matthews and Barbara Crews. Observer from the League of Women Voters was Mrs. Evelyn Hastings.

The meeting was called to order. The minutes which had previously been sent to the Board were approved.

Mr. Mayo gave the Financial Report and the Librarian's Report. The statistics for October were as follows:

Mr. Mayo reported that the Library was coming along well on the budget for 1970. He said that the Library had decided to join the Russell Library and a few others in trying to get the electricity rate lowered. We set a \$250.00 limit on our share of the attorney fees. He said we should be hearing something in the next few weeks. He reported that there had been 1,000 entries in the Library Book Mark contest. Summer Reading Program awards were given out during National Book Week. There werell,720 children enrolled and 1,290 completed the program.

Mr. Flannery moved that the Library close at 1:00 p.m. on December 24 and remain closed until 10:00 a.m. December 28 for the Christmas holiday. Mrs. Crews seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

Mr. Mayo and Mr. Staleup reported on the meeting they had with the Mayor and the City Manager. Mr. Watson said that the city expects the Library to become a separate tax body in 1972. The building completion date has been changed from September, 1972 to March, 1972. The city is letting contracts to start cleaning up the lot. The architects will select furniture and equipment on an hourly basis. They are in the process of making an estimate.

Mr. Flannery asked Mr. Mayo to present figures on how much Mr. Paine has been paid so far at the next meeting.

The Board decided to meetonn the 2nd Tuesday of December, the 8th.

Bills totalling \$10,131.03 were approved by roll call.
