J. S. BOUGHTON DEAD
Old Citizen of Lawrence Died Sud-
denly This Afternoon. HAD BEEN IN USUAL HEALTH.
End Came Practically Without Warning to Anyone.
Coroner Pronounced Death Due to Attack of Apoplexy-Body Taken Home in Ambulance.
Taken Home in Ambulance. J. S. Boughton, one of the old- est settlers in this county and pro- prietor of the Boughton book store, on Massachusetts street, dropped dead of apoplexy at his store about 1 o'clock this afternoon. The remains were taken at one to Bussing's un- dertaking rooms and then to the family home, 1228 Ohio street. Mr. Boughton had been home for dinner. The family had company and he had eaten a hearty meal and lingered to visit. When he returned to the store he hurried so as to let his clerk, Miss Goings, go to her din- ner. He entered the store, appa- rently very well. She put on her wraps to leave and, when she reached the door, turned to look back. She saw him throw up his hands and fall. She ran back, but he was dead when she reached him. Mr. Boughton has lived here for a great many years. The family con- sists of Mrs. Boughton, one daugh- ter, Gerfrude, who was married a few weeks ago, and two sons, Sid- ney and Paul Boughton. Gertrude is now Mrs. A. E. Ireland of Em- poria. Sidney Boughton works for the John Hutt Construction compa- ny, railroad contractors. When it was discovered that Mr. Boughton had fallen the elder Dr. Phillips was summoned at once. He made examination of the body, sàw that life was extinet, and deter- mined that the cause was apoplexy.
It is not likely that an inquest will be held as there is little doubt as to the cause. M. Boughton had lived here for so many years that he was consid-
ered a fixed part of the eity. He had been in gusines at the same stand for many years and was wide- ly known. He was a member of the Methodist church, as also are the members of his family.
There has not yet been time for the making of funeral arrangements, which will be announced later. o
