A certificate of membership for Mrs. Nellie Walton certifies that she is an acceptable member of the First Methodist Episcopal Church in Lawrence and is affectionately commended to the fellowship of The Friends Church in Lawrence. Signed - Jas. Marvin, Preacher in charge. Date - Nov 1st 1886.

A letter of right of membership from the Springdale monthly meeting received for Amos G. Wilson and Martha Wilson, his wife with minor children, Edgar, and Mabel Pearl Wilson. Signed - Andrew Jones and Isabell Hess, clerks; James G. Small, correspondent. Dated 1st month 9th 1892.

Letter from J. P. Stanley, Kansas City, Mo., dated June 6th 1893, requests that membership be discontinued and name be taken from the records of the church.

Most early Douglas County records spell the surname WEIXELDORFER as WEICHSELDORFER.

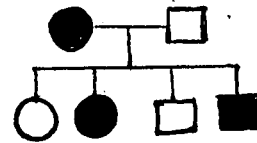


GENEALOGICAL TIP



"Jane DOE, born 4-6-96". Have you ever received a pedigree chart or a family group sheet with a date written in this manner? If so, you may have wondered, "Does this mean that Jane was born on April 6, 1896 or June 4, 1896?" You may even have been unsure of the correct century.

To avoid confusion, genealogists would do well to adopt a standardized way of writing dates on their genealogical forms. (i.e., day, month and year). The month should be spelled out but may be abbreviated. The year should have four digits. For example: John SMITH, born 7 Mar 1856 and Mary DOE, born 10 Jul 1791.



Genetic Disease: MALIGNANT HYPERTHERMIA

The following is an article by Richard Tomshack which appeared in the November 1982 (Vol. 8, #IV) issue of the quarterly publication, LOST IN CANADA?, Joy Reisinger, Editor and Publisher. 1020 Central Avenue, Sparta, WI 54656. Reprinted with permission.

MH is an inherited muscle abnormality, characterized by reactions to several drugs normally used during anaesthesia. Boy, what a bunch of big words. Let's cut the red tape and get right down to what is MH. Whenever you smile, talk, or move a muscle, a body function takes place without your knowledge. The muscle creates Calcium. In creating calcium, the muscle also develops heat. The heat is normally dissipated by the body with no problem, either in a MH person or a non-MH person.

So what is the problem? The problem lies in the MH person being unknown to medical personnel. If a MH person receives an inhalational anaesthetic, used under normal conditions, the anaesthetic could falsely ask the body for more calcium, up to 3,000 times the normal amount. This causes a vast increase in heat, which if not reversed, is fatal.

Now I may ask, what is all this medical talk doing in a genealogical publication? Well, MH is a genealogical problem. Research done by Dr. B. Britt of Toronto, Canada, shows that her MH patients trace their ancestors back to the Acadian line of DUPUIS. To be precise, George DUPUIS and Flave BONNEVILLE, married 12 Nov 1838, in St. Anicet, PQ.

What you have read so far is fact. In all fairness to this article and to the reader, I feel that I must introduce myself. My name is Richard Tomshack and I have been doing genealogy for some 10 or 12 years. I do this strictly as a hobby. I also have no formal education beyond high school. I think this is important to this article. I say this because I may say something in this article that may or may not conflict with Dr. Britt.

I would like to point out at this time, that Dr. Britt is a world renowned doctor and very qualified working with MH. Now to finish this article. I have talked with various people, both lay and doctors, and have read various medical journals and MH pamphlets. It appears to me that MH is a product of an ethnic group, with numerous Consanguinous marriages. If this be fact, then it would hold true with the descendants of Sylvain DUPUIS and Francoise LeBLANC, married ca. 1745, rehab. Assumption 1767.

All MH patients traced by Dr. Britt, are descendants of this line. Both DuPUIS and LeBLANC lead back to Acadia, as opposed to French Quebec. At this point, Dr. Britt agrees with me, (or I with her) that this DuPUIS line has something to do with MH. I hope to convince her of the LeBLANC connection, at our next meeting (scheduled for late September 1982).

Whatever medical knowledge I have gained, or lack there of, I do plan on tracing all the descendants of Sylvain DuPUIS and Francoise LeBLANC and present that information to Dr. Britt. She will have the final say. Since there is no cure for MH, Dr.

Malignant Hyperthermia continued:

Britt plans to enter all this information in a computer. On a national scale, a doctor will then be able to check the computer, prior to surgery, and see if you are part of an MH line. Prior to surgery is the key. If they know beforehand a person is of an MH line, different procedures can be used in the operating room. Knowledge prior to surgery will give the doctors a few extra minutes that may save a life. I'll never know if my work gave a doctor a few extra minutes, or if I saved a life with my work, I'll only know that I tried.

For those persons interested in more information on Malignant Hyperthermia, there are medical associations in both Canada and the U.S. These are for lay persons, interested in raising money for research and compiling family histories of known MH persons. Their addresses are:

There are other interesting articles about Malignant Hyperthermia in Vol 25, Nos. 2,3 and 4 (1978-79) of the Wisconsin State Genealogical Society Newsletter taken from articles in the Milwaukee Sentinel.

In these articles, Malignant Hyperthermia is called, "a hereditary disease of the muscle that affects hundreds of families in the Midwest." Some excerpts from the article are: "Wisconsin is a hot spot." "One of the longest affected bloodlines in the world extends into the state. Its known lineage stretches back nine generations to the early 1800's. Its roots are planted in what was Bohemia, now Czechoslovakia." "Physicians have constructed interlocking genealogies with about 3,000 names. The genealogies were gathered from hundreds of interviews with family members and by searching through courthouse records and family Bibles for birth, marriage and death records. About 40 surnames have been identified."

A "local genealogy buff, 74 year old Alfred Straub has put together the family trees of about 75 clans in the Marathon county area. One of those genealogies is 190 pages long and includes the names that have appeared most often on hospital records of unexplained deaths following anesthesia." Mr. Straub is credited with saving 5-10 lives because of his genealogical research work.

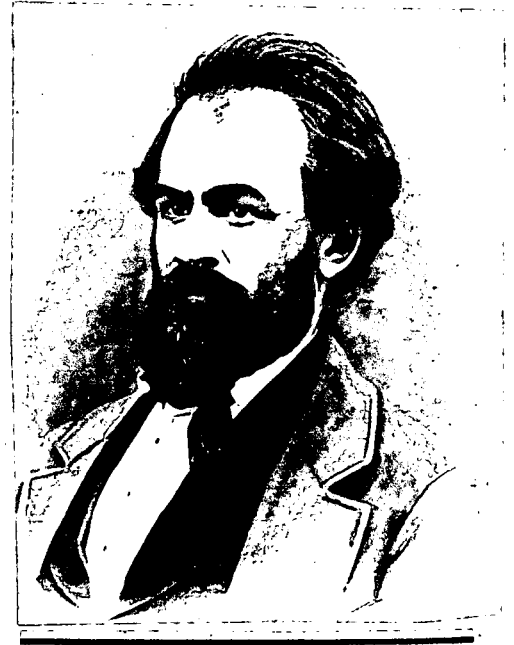

JOSEPH GARDNER and HIS CABIN



Joseph GARDNER (1820-1863), born Union Co. Ind. Immigrated to Lawrence, KS in 1855. He was President of the first Douglas Co. Fair in 1858. His portrait is at the Kansas State Historical Society in Topeka, KS.

The cabin pictured above was the log cabin of Joseph GARDNER, erected in 1857 near Lone Star by Joseph GARDNER with the help of Thomas OVERFIELD and Silas BOND. At this place a border battle was fought on June 9, 1860. According to a notation on this photograph, "Hard PETRICIAN, of Leocompton, was shot by Joseph GARDNER and Napoleon SIMPSON (colored) was killed by Jake HERD, who was concealed behind the well curb shown in the picture." The Joseph GARDNER cabin was located in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30, Township 13, Range 19, which was then in Washington Township but is now in Clinton township, (Douglas County).

The photograph from which this reduced-size copy was made, was donated to the Kansas State Historical Society in Topeka, Kansas on June 2, 1918 by Theodore GARDNER. Copies of this photograph and many other old photographs concerning early Kansas pioneers and scenes are available for purchase from the Photo-duplication and Copy Services, Kansas State Historical Society, Topeka, Kansas.

The following is a letter written to Miss Annie O. GILMORE, 1302 Eleventh St., Santa Monica, California, from Josephine ANDERSON, Rt. 3, Eudora, Kansas, dated February 27, 1910. Permission to print this was given by Dr. Robert W. Hughes, a descendant of the GILMORE family.

Dear Annie:

After dinner I looked at the couch then at the desk and decided in favor of the desk. It is a bright day but cold, if it hadn't rained yesterday Jessie thought she would try going to Eudora. I haven't been anywhere since before Christmas. They will surely think I have gone south for the winter, or something else. What do you think we have been doing? I have been braiding the front of my new dress and Jessie has embroidered two white waists for herself. I must try and get my dress done for Easter.

Your letter was very interesting. We laughed over your going as far as your money would take you. Tell Mary we don't want always to be sensible and I liked my valentine. Mrs. DOUGHERTY sent Jessie and I each a lace one such as pleased us when we were younger. Mrs. D. is in Lawrence. She expects to come home on Tuesday. Ella is in K.C. most of the time but comes to Lawrence Tuesdays and Fridays. S.S. is still in Des Moines. Did you know that Ethel has a little daughter, born Jan. 27?

I would have liked to see the Air ships, but I do not feel like trusting myself to them yet. Your Calla lilies would be beautiful but I love the roses. I have some hyacinths and crocus in bloom and Jessie brought me a fine geranium from town. We have enjoyed watching them. I hope this will reach you before you leave Santa Monica. How soon are you coming home? I must write to father's brother. He celebrated his 90th birthday the 11th of this month, went 4 miles on the trolley and took supper with his sister-in-law and some old friends. Our Chicago aunt died Jan. 7. It was her 77 birthday. We miss her. She wrote to us and we are getting to be so few. Lots of love to all of you, Mrs. POOL included.

Mr. G. was united in marriage in Tippecanoe County, Ind., April 3, 1856, to Miss Susan C., daughter of John WIDELL. They have five children—Annie O., born November 15, 1857; Solon T., born April 14, 1862; Mary C., born July 18, 1860; Josephine, born January 18, 1866; Nydia, born December 29, 1867. Mr. G. is one of the enterprising farmers of Kansas, having several tenants on his large farm, whom he keeps employed. Mr. G. is a member of the M.E. Church.

The following letter was submitted for The Pioneer by Georgianna Brune, of Rt. 3, Lawrence, KS. It is a copy of a letter written by her paternal grandmother, Mary TILLOTSON EBERHARD (Mrs. Abraham) to her great-grandmother, Cornelia TILLOTSON (Mrs. William) in Osawkie, KS. The "Abe" mentioned in the letter refers to Mary TILLOTSON EBERHARD's husband, Abraham EBERHARD.

North Lawrence
Aug 30th (18)74

Dear Mother:

Yours of the 14 was received the 19. We are all well. It is dry as ever it rained more the night you wer here than it has since. There have been good showers all around us. It seams to me I never saw it look so much like rain and never get a drop.

We have to haul water to wash with. Abe has dug out a spring at the creek, we get water for the house, hogs and horses. Friants have dug a well, have real good water and plenty of it.

Abe has sold nearly all of his hogs. He got two & half cts. He could have got 3 after he got to town of another man but thought it a mean trick so let them go. He said they wer coming up but he could not keep them. The grasshoppers have destroyed things so it will be harder times than ever this winter. Abe says he wont have corn enough for his horses & half enough feed for the cattle. He is talking of going south to put up hay, there is none to be had about here. He has one more stack since you was here. He says there is about 12 or 13 ton in it. He did intend to sell four head of cattle but they are worth nothing & he does not know what to do. Some of the cattle men are driving south to winter.

The people wer half crazy when the hoppers came. They cut corn day & night Sundays & all the time & some (can't decipher the next word; it looks like 'third' their corn). Abe thought it might as well go in the field as to mold after it was gathered. Abe says he never saw as many long faces in his life.

Smith & wife wer up last Sunday, says the gardners are entirely cleaned out. Said he would like to make you all a visit but was afrade to go & leave things for there is so much stealing going on. Said Bill had been out of employment for some time. Was ging to Kansas City to work on the R Road. Abe would like to know if there is any prospect for hay up there. If there is he would like to know soon as he will have to do something or let the cattle starve. George started for Ill. Tuesday, there is a great many leaving.

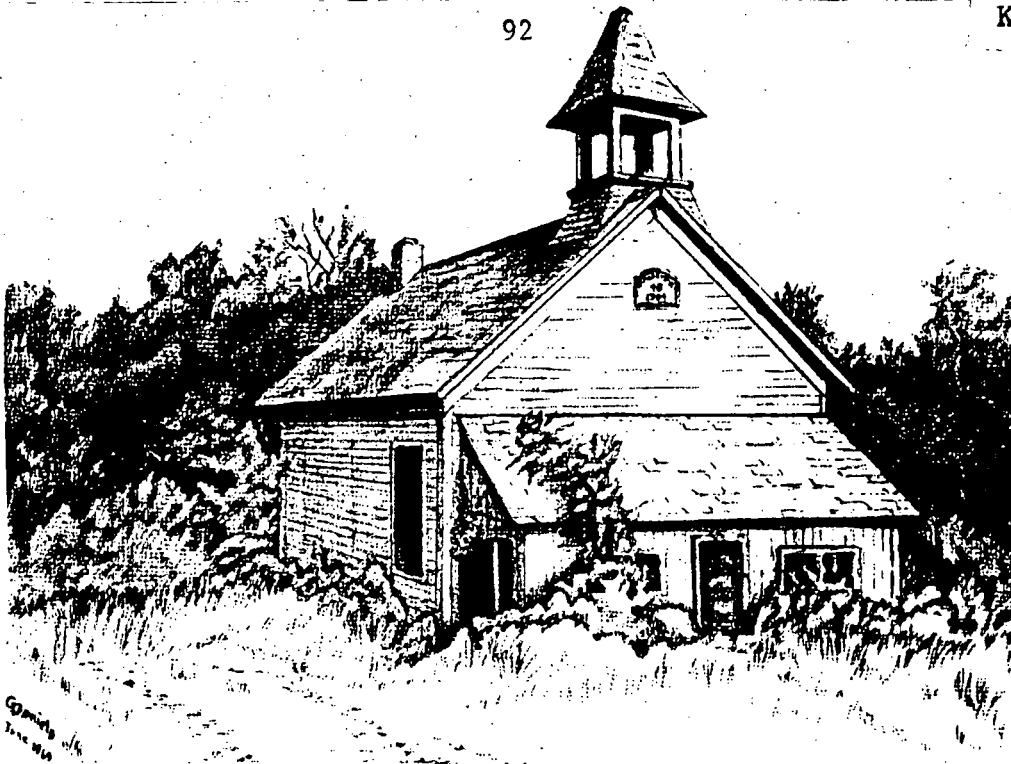
How is Bell & the rest of the folks. I wrote to her when I did to you and have not rec'd any answer. I directed it to Osawkee thinking she would get it sooner there. Is Nan Brown living? Think you do well quilting don't see how you stand it this hot weather. You don't intend to do all of her quilting this fall do you?

Well, Mother I will be satisfied with whatever you & the rest are. I think we had all aughto think of expense & be as saveing as possible. I think as you are all there you had better get it all settled & we will be up this fall, if no preventing. Don't wate for me for any thing will suit me so the rest are satisfied. Think it had aughto be done right away. Don't put off as I can't say any thing more on this subject. Write soon & often, as ever,

Abe had a letter from home yesterday. His Mother don't know wheter she will come out this fall or not. Crops are poor there they have had it very dry there too.



DEER CREEK DIST. NO. 48

There were at least two early schools in the Stull community before Kansas became a state. One was about one and one-half miles south of Stull on the farm owned by August Kampschroeder. The other, dated about 1860, was two and one-half miles southwest of Stull near a rock quarry on August Walters' place. This was a two-room log cabin on a bluff at the foot of which was a well, and was a community undertaking taught by a parent or teacher paid by subscription. Children came to it from a good many miles around; church and Sunday school also were held there with a Mr. Brown doing the preaching and living in a house afterward occupied by Christy Petefish.

The next schoolhouse was a frame building located about one-half mile west and one mile north of Stull on the southeast corner of what is now the farm of Wm Henry Jr. It was built by Peter Eberhart Sr., for the use of his own children, with a teacher hired and paid by him. A year or so later, John Damn Sr., and Jacob Hildenbrand offered to pay part of the expenses if their children too, could go to this school. Other parents then asked for the same privilege and the enrollment thus increased. This school operated for at least five years.

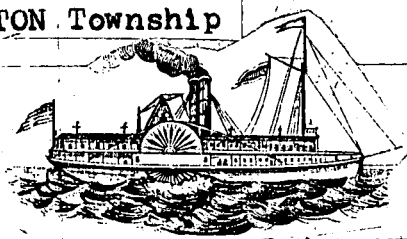
On August 1, 1879, E.S. Lane and Lucinda Lane his wife, deeded to the Board of District No. 48, one and one-fourth acres of land described as follows: beginning at the Northeast corner of the N.W. 1/4 of Sec. 36, T. 12, R. 17, thence running West 12 1/2 rods, thence South 16 rods, thence East 12 1/2 rods, thence North 16 rods to place of beginning. This plot was to return to the original estate, should its use for school purposes be terminated.

Mr. Eberhart's schoolhouse is assumed to have been purchased by the district, and not being centrally located, was moved to this newly acquired site. This was done with a stump-puller and horses. The building had to be anchored every fifty to one-hundred feet, winched forward as far as it would go, then re-anchored further on and the process repeated as many times as necessary to get the job done. The task consumed two weeks. Apparently, education wasn't something to be rushed into.

When set on the new site, the schoolhouse faced east, and was furnished with walnut benches having at least three pupils to each one. It was painted brown on the outside, and named "Brown Jug" in consequence. However, the name was eventually discarded, the building painted white and re-named "Deer Creek," for the little creek that flows nearby.

An old record of 1886, shows the teacher's salary for that entire term was \$210.00 and the cost of incidentals, \$22.00.

The above information is a portion of the history of Deer Creek District No. 48 taken from the book, Rural Schools and Schoolhouses of Douglas County, Kansas, by Goldie Piper Daniels. This book is available for purchase through the Douglas County Genealogical Society.



KANSAS RIVER STEAMBOATS

Many of us in this 20th Century have wondered if there were any steamboats on the Kansas river. As we see it today, it is nothing but a small stream, hardly a rowboat can navigate on it. Many of us have seen the days when this river could rampage and wipe out homes and many a crop land. With the lakes we now have, they keep this old river pretty well under control and we fear not of it flooding. There is a very interesting story that has been passed down through the generations and also appeared in the first newspaper of Lecompton called "The Lecompton Union" in 1856 about a side-wheeler that navigated the Kansas river. At this time Mrs. Rachel Jane Todhunter, an early pioneer lady of Lecompton and some other ladies saw a side-wheeler called the "Saerie Queen" tied up at the wharf. The ladies looked upon the beautiful deck of the side-wheeler and thought what a wonderful place to have a Ball. Mrs. Todhunter was well acquainted with Mr. Geary, the governor of the Kansas Territory, so she and the ladies approached him and asked him to persuade the Captain of the boat to have a Ball that evening on the boat. The Captain was agreeable, so the ladies hurried about the community spreading the word so everyone could prepare their costumes for the evening. The Captain readied the boat, the music was found and that evening the Ball was held. The ladies had taken their ball gowns out of their trunks and displayed their glittering attire for the first time in the Kansas Territory. This was probably the first Ball held in the Territory of Kansas. This showed the pioneers' ability to contrive to have a wonderful time under such difficult circumstances at that time.

Another interesting article appeared in a later newspaper of Lecompton, called The Kansas National Democrat on March 24, 1859 is as follows:

"The first trip of the season from Kansas City to this place via Kaw river was made by the Steamer "Silver Lake," Capt. Wilburn, on Monday last. It is a fine sternwheel steamer, capable of carrying 50 tons, and well calculated we think for the business of the river. Through the persuasions of our citizens, on Tuesday morning, the Captain went up the river as far as Topeka. We were informed by the Captain that some of the citizens of Lawrence endeavored to dissuade him from coming to this place, stating the river unnavigable. The Captain informs that the worst bar in the whole river, he found below Lawrence. We hope to see the "Silver Lake" continue her trips regularly to this place and would urge upon our citizens the importance of extending to her a generous support."

Another article in the same paper on May 12, 1859--"This week our wharf has been enlivened by the arrival of two steamboats, the GUS LINN and SILVER LAKE. The GUS LINN left Kansas City on the 10th instant, and reached here on the 12th, and then proceeded above as far as Fort Riley. We think that she will be able, as the river is in good boatable order to reach that place.

The SILVER LAKE discharged all her freight here, and took on board a cargo of corn, and left for Kansas City.

It is the intention of the owners of these boats to run them the entire season up the Kaw, which, from their light draught of water, we think they can. This enterprise, of navigating the Kaw, should, and we have reason to believe will be warmly seconded by the citizens of the towns on the river. Merchants having goods at Kansas City will find it much cheaper to have them shipped by either of these steamers than have them hauled in wagons--an old foggy way of doing."

MESHACK SANDERS, who owns and occupies a farm at Twin Mound, Marion Township, Douglas County, was born near Shelbyville, Ky., December 9, 1840, a son of Meshack and Lucy (Grady) Sanders, also natives of Kentucky. His father, who was the son of a lifelong Kentuckian, grew to manhood near Shelbyville, where during his active life he was employed as overseer of slaves on a large plantation. He died about four months before his son and namesake was born, and of his five children only this son and William Thomas, of Missouri, survive. In 1849 the mother removed with her children to Bartholomew County, Ind., where she died at seventy-two years of age. At the time of the removal to Indiana, our subject was a boy of nine years. He grew to manhood on a farm and had few advantages, for he was obliged to be self-supporting from an early age. From nineteen to twenty-two years of age he served an apprenticeship to the blacksmith trade, after which he was employed as a journeyman. In 1865 he came to Kansas and followed his trade in Leavenworth, also worked in the government employ at Fort Leavenworth. During 1867 he went to Fort Laramie, Wyo., where he worked for the government. The following year he returned to Leavenworth. In the spring of 1869 he went on the plains, in the employ of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, traveling through Nebraska and Wyoming. In the fall of 1869 he secured work for the government at Fort Steele, Wyo., and in the spring of the next year he went into the mining district at Sweetwater, Wyo., where he engaged in mining. Coming back to Kansas, he spent a short time at Pond City, thence proceeded to Lawrence, and in 1872 opened a blacksmith's shop in the latter city.



Selling his shop in 1881, Mr. Sanders purchased a farm at Twin Mound and, building a shop on the land, he followed his trade, besides cultivating his land and engaging in feeding cattle. In 1892 he retired from his trade, since which time he has devoted himself to superintending his farm of three hundred and twenty acres. He still owns real estate at Columbus, Ind., where he was reared. In politics he is a Republican. During the war he went out with a company of independents for the purpose of heading off General Morgan at the time of the latter's rail into Ohio and Indiana. At this writing he is a member of the county central committee of his party. He has served as a director of the schools and as treasurer for five years. For some years he was identified with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. The temperance cause has in him an ardent champion.

March 21, 1872, Mr. Sanders married Fannie C. Faxon, who was born in Scituate, Mass., and by whom he has two daughters, Minnie E. and Clare Corinne. Mrs. Sanders is a daughter of William T. and Harriet (Cook) Faxon, natives respectively of Braintree and Scituate, Cape Cod, Mass., her father a man of ability and intelligence. For some years he carried on a mercantile business in Scituate, but in 1858 left the east and came to Lawrence, where he engaged in the meat business. Politically he was a Democrat. He died in Lawrence in 1889, when sixty-four years of age. Of his seven children only three daughters are now living, those besides Mrs. Sanders being Eunice, wife of Alexander Marks, of Lawrence; and Annie, wife of Harry King.

SPURGEON died intestate in the County of Douglas State of Kansas on or about the 5th day of April 1909 and left surviving him his widow Mary M. SPURGEON, and children Joseph W. SPURGEON, Ida E. GORDON, Maggie DAVIDSON, and Jennie CULVER, said children being over 21 years old at the time of their fathers death aforesaid. I was well acquainted with the financial condition of the estate of G.R. SPURGEON, deceased, at the time of his death, and know that he died solvent, and that his debts have all been paid.

Boy Meets Girl

In the spring of 1909 I met Hattie Mae ROSE. She had come to the Brackett Rural School to take her ninth grade finals. She arrived on a horse equipped with a sidesaddle—the first I had ever seen. We got acquainted that day. Since she had to pass our place on her way to town, I also was able to see her occasionally then. Later on we sometimes went to the Baptist Church together on Sundays.

From that point we began to take in an occasional show at the "Nickel", the first moving picture show west of the Mississippi River. After the show, we could be found at Wiedemann's Confectionary Shop, drinking hot chocolate topped with either whipped cream or ice cream, and for another five cents, a bowl of oyster crackers to accompany it.

Another thing about our early acquaintance that I shall never forget was receiving a valentine from Hattie.

About this time Hattie joined the Baptist Church. Rev. O.C. BROWN was its pastor. I remember him particularly as being accustomed to riding out from Lawrence on his bicycle two Sunday afternoons each month to hold services in the Barker School House. We often attended and I still claim the Baptist Church as my own even though I never became a member of it.

In the summer of 1910 I left home and went to work for S.M. GENTRY, a farmer who lived near enough to Hattie's home so that I could walk to see her frequently at her parents' home where she lived along with her four younger-not-too-angelic brothers.

Courtship Via Horse and Saddle

Hattie attended high school for one and one-half years, rooming with the Jay BOND family in Lawrence, but illness caused her to leave school and prevented her returning later, so she went to work as a clerk, first in the Housemen's Clothing Store, then at Barteldes Seed Store and later at the Kaw Valley Creamery.

An incident occurred about 1912 that I recall vividly. Hattie was rooming at the Healey Home, 712 Kentucky Street, where several other girls also stayed. One evening when I arrived by horseback to call on Hattie, I was besieged by all the girls asking me to remain there for the night. I promptly refused until I learned that on the previous night a large black man had climbed through an open window on the porch into the room of one of the girls. He was frightened away by her screams. A call to the police only 1/2 block away brought a response thirty minutes later, and to make sure their arrival was expected by everyone, they came with sirens blasting. So I consented to remain for the night on the porch. You never saw girls move so fast in preparing me a bed there. I tied my horse to a tree in Central Park, and fortunately no one came along in the night and turned him loose.

Courtship Via Horse and Buggy

One spring day in 1912, I walked to Lawrence, rented a horse and buggy for \$1.50, picked up Hattie, drove eight miles southwest of Lawrence to the farm where my brother Bill and his wife Myrtle lived, and spent the evening there. On the way back to town the weather changed and we liked to freeze. I took Hattie back to her rooming house, returned the horse to his stable,

walked the five miles back to my place of employment. This warmed me as the day which had started out warm and balmy had turned bitter cold to the discomfort of both of us.

Later that spring I moved back to my old home with my father as failing health forced him to sell the home. We moved to the farm in Pleasant Valley where my brother Bill was living. Later that summer I bought brother Bill out and my father and I established a partnership.

During this time Hattie had returned to her parental home fourteen miles from me, so I usually drove to the ROSE home on Saturday nights and remained there until Sunday night. Once in awhile it was nearer Monday morning when I got home. Often I would fall asleep in the saddle and let my horse take me home. On one of these occasions, Hattie and I started out early on Sunday morning for a family reunion to be held at the home of Hattie's uncle and aunt, Jake and Nancy CUMMINGS, who lived eight miles southwest of Stull. By the time I had made that sixteen-mile trip plus fourteen miles back to my place, I had had a day!

Start of Our Married Life

After about six years of getting "acquainted", Hattie and I were married on April 28, 1915. It was wild crabapple time, all in bloom. The wedding took place at the ROSE home with Rev. O.C. BROWN, the pastor. Several close relatives were there. We left for our new home—borrowing a pillow and walking around the hill to our future home. I still live there.

Hattie's maternal grandparents, Joseph H. and Martha (RANDOLPH) HARRISON had settled here in 1854 and had homesteaded this farm. The house nestles cosily just under the brow of a hill on the sunny southern slope. Much of the lumber for it was hauled from Leavenworth by ox-cart, and so well was it built by its owner-builder that it stands today in good condition. Three generations were born in this house: Lucy HARRISON (ROSE), Hattie ROSE (WIGGINS), and our daughter Elizabeth WIGGINS (SANDERS).

The day before our wedding, we bought our furniture from the C.J. ERICKSEN Company—a cookstove, kitchen cabinet, bed springs, mattress, dresser, buffet, oak rocking chair, round oak table, and 6 oak chairs at \$1.75 each. That is all I can remember—the total for all was \$125.00 delivered. Mrs. ERICKSEN took off \$5.00 because we paid cash.

With the \$5.00, we bought things at Frank STRONG and Clark PRINGLE's grocery store—pepper, salt, spices, sugar, flour, lard and other items.

The cash we paid for the furniture was borrowed from Jack KELSEY, a cattle buyer, also a friend. I still have the round oak table and oak rocking chair.

A few days after we were married, we were shivareed by ten men. When they arrived we were sound asleep but not for long! One man set his shotgun on the window sill near our bed—BOOM—we were not long getting up! We thought we had to dress up, which took time in the near dark room. The men said, "If you don't come out soon, we are coming in after you!" A few days later some of the men came to our place. They took up a collection and bought us six nice silver spoons. We were shivareed again by the women and kids.

Next about our eats—we had milk, made our own butter and cottage cheese, did not have much meat. We often had tuna salad. Hattie would put aster leaves in a bowl to make it look nice. We had the aster bed in an old corn planter wheel. When bringing our mules by the aster bed from the pasture, they ate some of the asters and made Hattie very unhappy. Often I would hum, "Asters by the brookside make asters in the brook," which never failed to get a rise out of her.

We took in less than \$150.00 the first year. We had no telephone bills, no lights, no gas. We sold some cream—got a check for 51¢, butterfat 17¢ per pound. We raised some potatoes. Hattie baked bread—the first was a dandy, later she became a champion. Hattie was a good cook, an expert at making sour cream raisin pie, using lard to make the pie crust. We had a few chickens, enough eggs to get by. Fried eggs good and brown are good eating if you are hungry. I still would like to have some sour cream raisin pie, also some raw fried potatoes crusty. We had one cow giving milk, two heifers to be fresh later, several small heifers.

In 1916, we had more ground to farm. It was a wet year, we planted the corn the third time. It was getting late by that time and Jack Frost finished it. The second year we butchered a hog—had meat, lard and also a telephone.

The first year we were married we did not have meat very often. We would buy 25 cents worth of round steak and have brown gravy—a treat. We raised a few chickens, tried to have one big enough to eat by the 4th of July. Sometimes it would not be too big—maybe two pounds. We also had homemade ice cream and angel food cake. We were poor, but happy.

One time my mother-in-law brought a fried young squirrel to a picnic we had. It sure was good. Now we won't even eat one. Mr. ROSE always had a big garden—winter onions, surely good in early spring. Also parsnips, and some years when cabbage was plentiful, they would make a barrel of kraut. It was kept in the smokehouse. They gave us some when digging it out (it was frozen) and surely good raw. They also buried apples. The ROSE boys and I would run our arms back in a hole and get an apple—sometimes the apple would taste like the ground, but good.

Hattie loved flowers and had lots of them. She enjoyed the clubs she belonged to and especially the Lawrence Flower Club for which she helped judge flower shows several times. We planted many flowers and trees throughout the years. This year I counted 43 different flowers and 37 trees and bushes that bloom annually on our place. In the spring, I have a "Flower Day" and invite the ladies in the neighborhood to come and enjoy the flowers and have refreshments with me. I look forward to this each year.

The home where he was born and grew up is still standing—the stone house located just west of the Virginia Inn on Highway 40. It now houses the offices of Heritage Realty, and is co-owned by a great granddaughter of Frank WIGGINS, Mrs. Sandra GARBNER.

Hattie Mae ROSE was the daughter of Lucy Jane HARRISON and Siegel Albert ROSE. She was born March 24, 1893, Wakarusa Township, and died January 9, 1952 at Kansas City, Kansas. Jim and Hattie had two daughters: Martha Elizabeth (Mrs. Charles SANDERS) and Bernice Doris (Mrs. James KNOX).

Jim recently celebrated his 90th birthday and still lives on the farm in northwest Douglas County where Hattie and he started their married life.

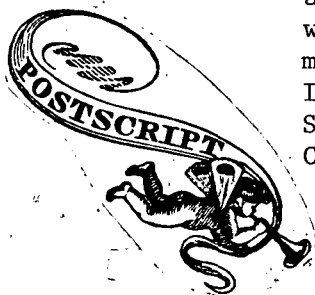
