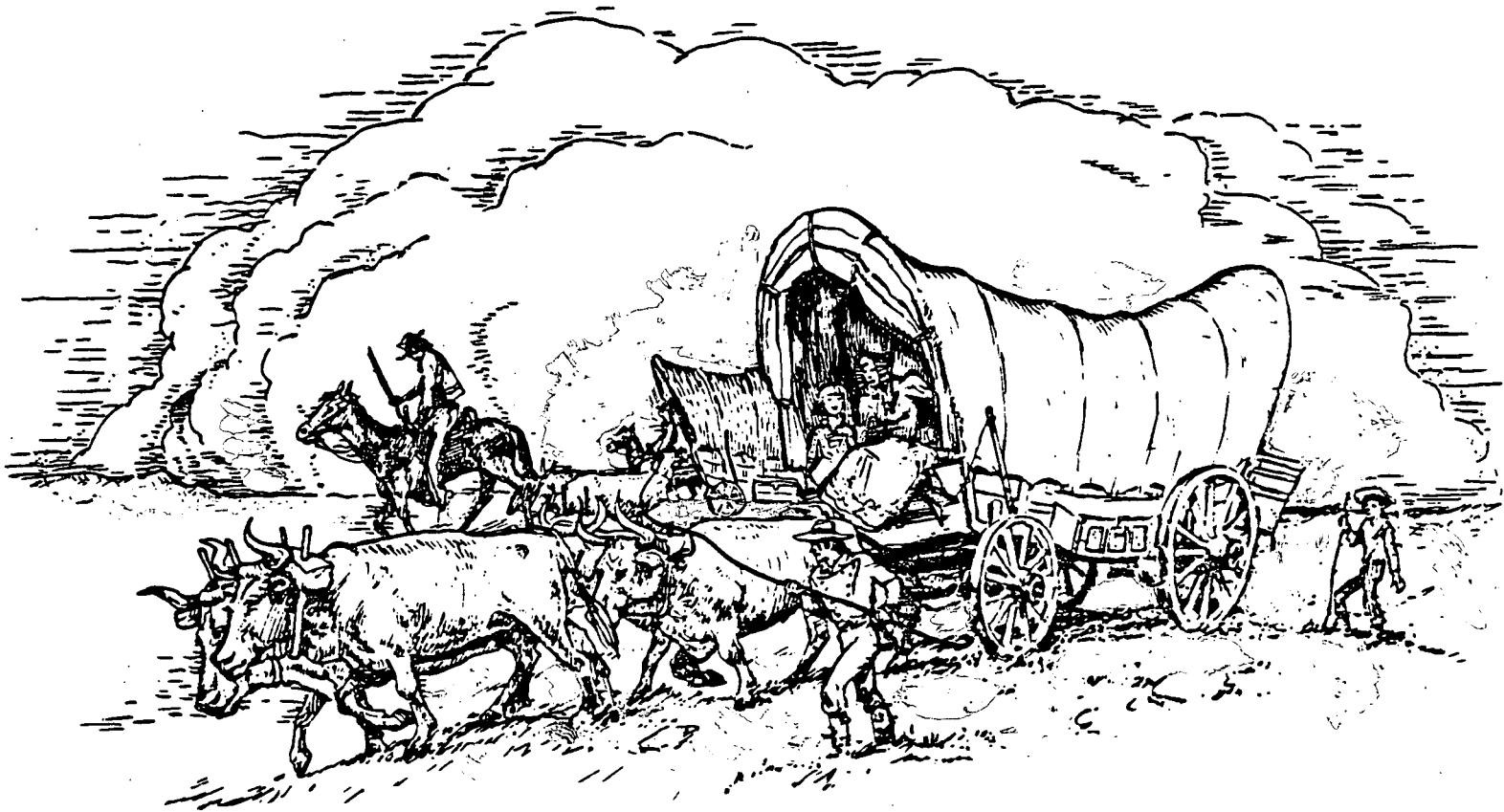

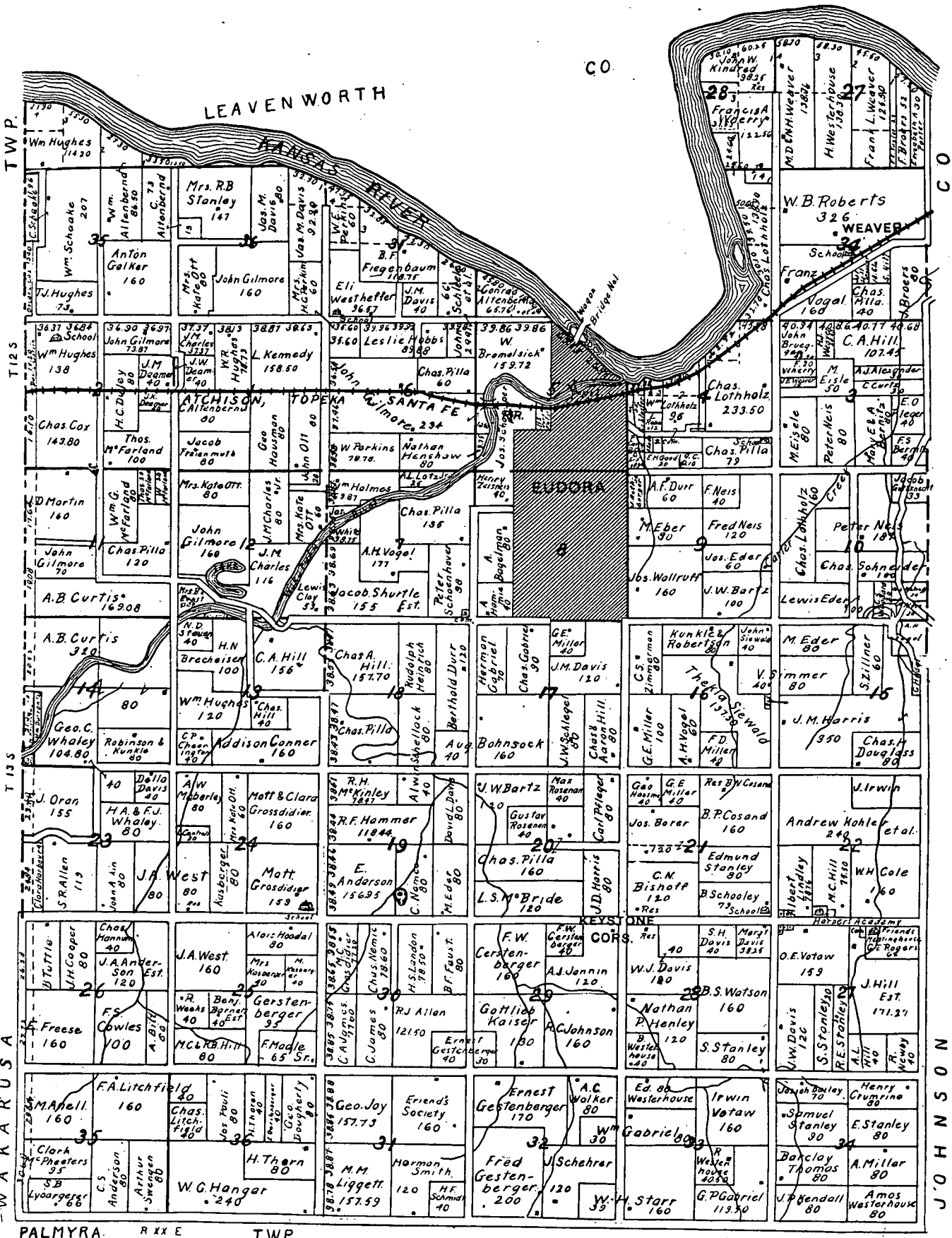

From Douglas County Atlas by D.B.M. SOUDEA (1909)  
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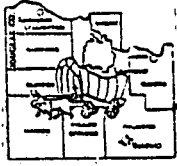

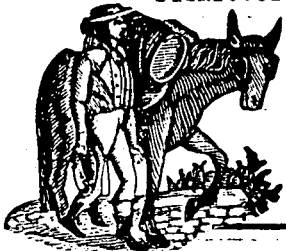

### GERMAN SETTLEMENT IN DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS.

There have been several German settlements in Douglas County Kansas since 1854. Most were situated in four or five distinct areas of the county: Stull (Dear Creek Settlement) in the NW; Eudora in the East; Worden in the South; Clearfield (Capt's creek); and Lawrence.

The Pennsylvania German immigration into Douglas County began by 1855 and the first Dunkard Church was organized in 1858. The EBERHART and ULRICH families were two of many who settled in the Willow Springs area. Some of those German families who settled in the area of present-day Stull were: HILDENBRAND, GRESS, FRICKER, HEIL, HOUK, BAHNMAIER, etc.

In 1856, three members of a German Immigrant Settlement (or Society) from Chicago, called Deutsche Ansiedlungs Verein (or New Settlers Committee) were sent out as a location committee to choose a townsite for a German settlement. The three men were: H. HEIMANN, F. BARTELDES and C. SCHEIFER. Land for the settlement at present-day Eudora was deeded to the Society by Chief Paschal FISH. Up until the late 1800's the German language was used in churches and other gatherings of the Germans in that area.

In Lawrence, many of the German merchant's stores of the last century were concentrated in the 700 and 800 block of Massachusetts St., such as stores owned by: William WIEDEMANN, who owned a popular ice cream and confectionary store; Charles ACHNING, hardware business; Leo STEINBERG, dry goods; Fred WIEMAN, cigar maker; and Carl NEUMANN, Central Drug Store (also called Deutsche Apotheke). A Turnhalle (or German gymnastic Club) was established in 1857 on the SW corner of 10th and N.Y. Sts. Later another Turnhalle was opened in 1867 at 9th and Rhode Island Sts. This stone building still stands today. A German newspaper, DIE GERMANIA, was founded in 1877 by Gottlieb OEHRLER and in later years Henry ALBACH was the editor and proprietor. This weekly paper was a popular one with local Germans up until the outbreak of World War I when its publication ceased.

By 1890, there were 1,011 persons living in Douglas County who had been born in Germany, according to the Federal Census. Today hundreds of Douglas County citizens can trace their descent from one or more of the early German settlers in the county.

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**LITTLE KNOWN SOURCE: GERMAN "ALIEN" REGISTRATION RECORDS**

A veritable "gold-mine" of genealogical material recently came to our attention and we would be remiss if we did not share this wonderful "find" with our fellow genealogists. We speak of the so-called "German Alien Registration forms" which are in the Federal Archives on Bannister Road in Kansas City, Missouri. If you find a registration form for one of your German ancestors there, you are in for a real treat. Because, not only will you learn your ancestor's date and place of birth, his or her parent's names and places of birth, but you will also see your ancestor's signature, fingerprints and best of all--a black and white photo of him or her taken in 1918.

A little background information might help to explain these registration forms. In 1918, the U.S. had been in W.W. I only one year, but anti-German sentiment was intense. One has only to read the local and national newspapers of that time period to get a sense of this. The Lawrence Daily Journal World of February 14, 1918 quoted from The Providence Rhode Island Journal which admonished citizens to:

"Be on guard".."Every German or Austrian in the U.S., unless known by years of association to be absolutely loyal should be treated as a potential spy. Keep your eyes and ears open".

One local example of this distrust was the treatment of Adolf Lutz, a German-American and a prominent businessman of Eudora, Kansas. He arrived at his offices one day to find them painted yellow. The Lawrence Daily Journal published his response in the June 20, 1918 issue.

"When I came to this country over 30 years ago, I came with the intention of making this country my home; I took out my first papers the first year I was here and my second papers in 1892. I have tried honestly to live up to the laws of our country all the time and when the United States became involved in the present war, I never shirked or refused a call to help whatever way I could in giving my time and money for whatever purpose it was needed...I made the statement over and over again to Germans and Americans alike that since our country is in war with Germany, anybody who had any leanings towards his former home must put them aside and take the only proper stand...The stand for America and America alone. If this action brands me disloyal, and subject to attacks, I would like to know what I should do?..."

In April of 1917, Henry ALBACH, another German-American was requested to speak at a loyalty meeting as a representative of the nearly 1,000 citizens of Douglas County in "whose veins flows German blood." In his address he asked for tolerance and understanding.

But the Registration Act in February 1918 only served to create more intolerance. By Presidential Proclamation, all "natives, citizens, or subjects of the German Empire, being male 14 years and upwards who are not now naturalized as Americans are required to

registered as "alien enemies." The same type of registration was required in June 1918 for German-born females or those American women who were married to unnaturalized Germans.

Not only did the registrants have to give all of the vital statistics regarding themselves and close relatives, but they were fingerprinted and photographed. And in the event that they wished to move to another town, they were first required to submit a written request for permission to leave the area.

The Lawrence Daily Journal-World of February 7, 1918 reported:

"Among those who suffer innocently are a large number of fine old German men and women who came to this country years ago to make their homes and fortunes and who today are loyal to the core. Some of these men took out their first (naturalization) papers necessary to citizenship years ago and being given the right to vote forgot that anything else was necessary or knowing and neglected to complete their citizenship and therefore had to register among the alien Germans of the county. One of these fine old men was brought to tears the other day when he found he had to register as an alien of the country which had been his home so long."

According to the Lawrence Daily Journal World of February 16, 1918, eleven German "aliens" of Baldwin appeared for registration that week. "Some of them have been here since youth, being our most honored citizens, among others-civil war veterans."

It seems unimaginable to us now that these Germans, some of whom had been in the United States since the 1850's and considered themselves to be as American as their neighbors, should be subjected to the indignity of registration as an "alien enemy", but it happened here in Douglas County as well as in thousands of other registration centers across the country.

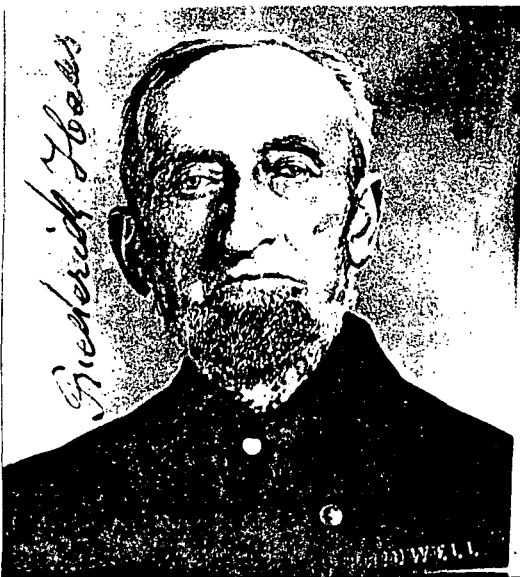

NINTH STREET BAPTIST CHURCH  
 CELEBRATES IT'S 122nd ANNIVERSARY

"In the hundred and twenty-four years of its existence, the congregation known as the Ninth Street Church has been identified by several names; the Second Missionary Baptist Mission, the Second Missionary Baptist Church, Warren Street Baptist Church and Ninth Street Baptist Church.

The Second Missionary Baptist Mission was established in 1863 by the New England Immigrant Aid Society. The pastor appointed by the Society was Father BATEMAN,

a white man, and the meetings were held in the upper floor of a building between Sixth and Seventh Street on Massachusetts Street, the present site of Green Brothers Hardware Store. The first baptized member was Mrs. Lizzie DRISDOM CARR, the mother of the late Mrs. Lula B. IRVING and grandmother of Mrs. Ethel MOORE.

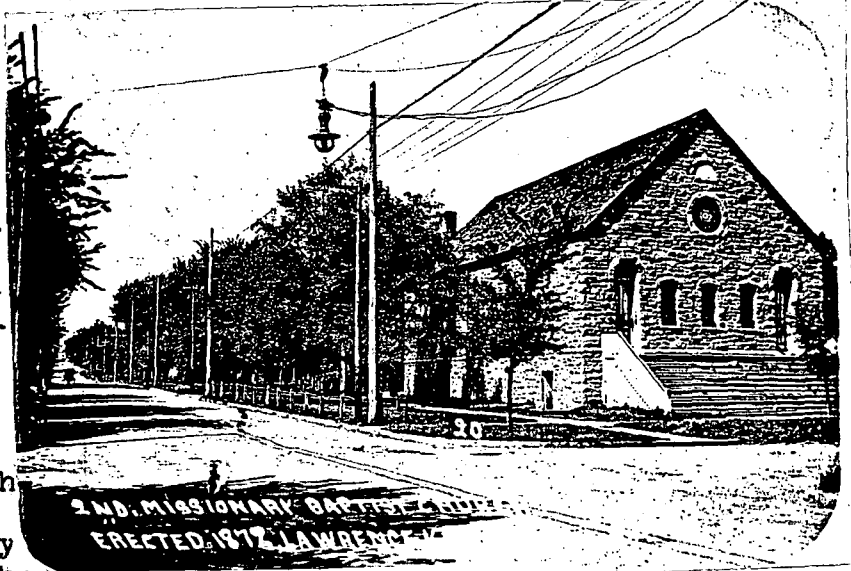

The lot on which Ninth Street now stands was deeded to the Emigrant Aid Society of New England by the Trustees of Lawrence Township in 1855 and was transferred by deed on March 26, 1882 to Isaiah ADAMS and others. On March 23, 1864 a deed was given from Isaiah ADAMS and Henry BRAYLING to the Trustees of the Second Missionary Baptist Church—namely, Alexander GREGG (an uncle of the late Bishop John A. GREGG), Bedford DRISDOM, Jordan CLARK, Edward SIMMS, Moses WHITE and Gabriel GRAY. Under the leadership of Rev. Bedford DRISDOM the building was started. In 1865 the church called Rev. DUDLEY at a salary of Three Hundred Dollars a year and whose pastorate lasted nine years. Then dissention arose over the payment of the pastor's back salary and a split developed. After a Sheriff's sale in 1875 it was deeded to Rev. Dudley LEE and wife justifying Rev. LEE's claim against the Church.

The split portion of the congregation purchased a site on Tenth and Connecticut Street and were known as the Little Gem Baptist Church, with Rev. B.T.W. JAMES as pastor who stayed three years.

Rev. Robert MARTIN was called to the pastorate of the Second Missionary Baptist Church; he divided his time between this church and a church in Kentucky. He was the father of Mrs. Hattie GRICE, Mrs. LAYTON and Mrs. RENICKE.

Rev. Washington MERCER was called in January. His aim was to reunite the split church and he succeeded in doing so. After nine years Rev. Dudley LEE and wife deeded the present site back to the Trustees for a consideration of One thousand one hundred sixty-six dollars and eighty-eight cents. The reunited church became known as the Warren Street Baptist Church and retained Rev. MERCER as pastor who completed the structure on the present site and served until 1885. "

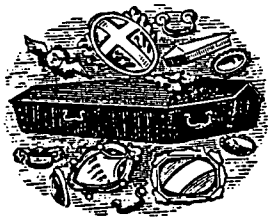

Biographical Sketch of: **Charles PILLA**

**C**HARLES PILLA. Among our German-American citizens who have been successful since settling in Kansas mention belongs to Mr. Pilla, the well-known business man of Eudora. Mr. Pilla was born in Rhenish Bavaria, Germany, February 19, 1830, and received a good education in the German language. At nineteen years of age he came to the United States, arriving in New York March 26, 1849. For fourteen years he remained in the vicinity of that city, and during ten years of the time he was employed as clerk and bookkeeper for the publishing house of E. Walker & Sons. In 1865 he came to Kansas for the purpose of entering into partnership with his brother F. L., who had started a small store in Eudora. The title of the firm became Pilla Brothers, which continued until his brother's death in 1871.

Being thus left sole proprietor of the store Mr. Pilla continued the business alone. In 1872 he enlarged the building and increased the quantity of stock carried. His store is now the largest of its kind in Eudora. In connection with the mercantile department, for some years he carried a stock of drugs, but this is now discontinued. Besides his mercantile interests he has engaged in farming in Douglas and Johnson Counties, where he owns large tracts of farm lands; and, while these places are operated by tenants, he nevertheless maintains an active supervision of the land and directs its management.

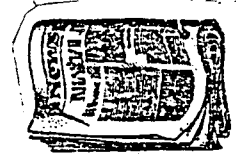
Upon the organization of the State Bank of Eudora, in which he was interested, Mr. Pilla was elected its president in 1893 a position which he has filled with the greatest efficiency. As a member of the firm of Pilla & Statler he also carries on a brick manufacturing business. In 1894 he erected a beautiful residence on a hill overlooking the village and commanding a fine view. At the time of the erection of the sweet corn factory, in 1883, he was one of the principal contributors to the same and became a stockholder in the company. He is a stockholder and director of the Eudora Creamery Company, and was a stockholder in the Leis chemical works, of Lawrence, Kans. When the Kimball plow factory was started in Lawrence he assisted in the organization of the company controlling the plant, but the enterprise did not prove successful. All movements of a progressive character where the benefit accruing to the people is unquestionable have received the impetus of his encouragement and practical aid.

Since attaining his majority Mr. Pilla has always been a staunch Republican. As mayor of Eudora, and as a member of the city council, also as a school director, he has been able to greatly promote local projects, and has given an impetus to the welfare of his town and fellow-townsmen. In 1871 he received appointment as postmaster, and continued to fill the office until 1885. Prior to this, from 1865 to 1871, he served as assistant postmaster, having practically the entire charge of the office. Fraternally he is a member of Doric Lodge No. 83, A. F. & A. M; Lawrence

Commandery No. 4, K. T.; and Eudora Lodge No. 28, I. O. O. F., in which he is past grand. In religion he worships with the German Evangelical Church. He was married September 10, 1865, to Alice B. Smith, daughter of Paul and Catherine Smith. She was born on Staten Island and died in Eudora, January 15, 1899, leaving three daughters: Alvena E., wife of John E. Dolisi; Louisa P., wife of Spencer J. Lawson; and Molvie E., who has had charge of the home since her mother's death.

North Lawrence was formed in 1865 from territory taken out of Sarcoxie Township in Jefferson Co. Legislature of 1867 provided for formation of Grant Township out of Sarcoxie Township. Below is a newspaper editorial opposing Douglas County's acquisition of the Jefferson County land.

### COUNTY LINES

"The persistent efforts of a portion of the citizens of Douglas county to seize upon a portion of Jefferson, has few parallels. It is simply a covetuous desire, without any show of right, and can be defended on no grounds of reason, justice or good neighborship. The only plea set up is that Lawrence has made some outlays on roads- principally if not entirely in Leavenworth county-on this side of the river, and therefore she ought to have a part of Jefferson county! Who ever heard of Lawrence doing anything of the kind not immediately for her own benefit? If she built roads it was because her citizens believed it was for their interest to do so; and they never invested a dime in a road, except for an interested purpose; and they have ten times over received principal and interest for every cent they have thus expended on this side of the river.

But we have a counter-claim to this plea. It is this. The citizens of Lawrence have taken wood and lumber from Jefferson county in value a thousand-fold more than all the outlays on this side of the river in roads and everything else; and this wood and lumber have been taken without rendering an equivalent to this county. These are the facts. Let them be known!

Another claim set up is, that a portion of this county is convenient to Douglas! Indeed! If this plea is worth any thing, it is worth all the State, and Kansas may as well be annexed to Douglas at once as by piece-meal; for every time she extends her boundaries she will lay alongside of contiguous territory, which it will be convenient to get hold of. This is worse than a robber's plea. It is the very essence of bad neighborship. If we have a piece of land and choose to put our buildings for our own convenience or profit, on one edge of the land doew that give us a right to seize upon a portion of our neighbor's possessions, simply because they are contiguous?...If the river, God's own line of division, is not a stay to their greed, what other line can present a barrier to their rapacity?

"...Lawrence has had ten-fold more aid from the east than any other place in Kansas-more than all the rest of the State together; and yet she claims special privileges! A portion of her citizens want all; and is they had every thing they would still ask for something more!

This whole matter is in a nut-shell. The territory belongs to Jefferson county. We have kept it in its infancy at our expense. We therefore havē a just claim in right and equity to it. Douglas has none. The river is a natural boundary, therefore the best one. We simply want our rights and good neighborship, nothing more."

Note: Act giving Douglas County part of Jefferson Co lands was approved February 11, 1865. by S.J. Crawford, Governor.

Biographical Sketch of: **Marcelmus B. RAY**

**M**ARCELMUS B. RAY, who is engaged in farming in Kanwaka Township, Douglas County, was born in Jefferson City, Mo., April 8, 1852, a son of Luke E. and Marietta (Drown) Ray, natives of Cabell County, W. Va. His father, who was born in 1817, of Scotch parentage, learned the carpenter's trade in youth. He engaged in the mercantile business at Jefferson City and at Carthage, Mo., and built the village of Preston, eight miles from Carthage, where he remained until the time of the Civil war. Being in sympathy with the Union and living in Confederate territory, his surroundings became unpleasant and, indeed, dangerous. The bushwhackers stole all of the cattle and horses on his farm, and later burned the dwellings and other properties. Thereupon he took his family to Marysville, Kans., and in 1862 settled in Douglas County, where he purchased eighty acres in Kanwaka Township, later adding another tract of similar size. During the first years of his residence here he was a member of the home guard. He employed agents to manage the farms in Missouri, but never realized anything from the property. He became one of the well-known farmers of this township, and was a leader in local ranks of the Republican party. Since his death, in 1894, his widow has resided on the old homestead, which is managed by the subject of this sketch. The family comprised the following-named children: Eliza A., wife of Dr. G. W. Williams; Para Lee, who married John Maloy; Sarah, Mrs. Leroy J. Bean; Henry B., George W., Henry S. G., Marcelmus B., Luke E., deceased; Romaine F., wife of Joseph Howell; Brunie, deceased; and Grant, who died in infancy.

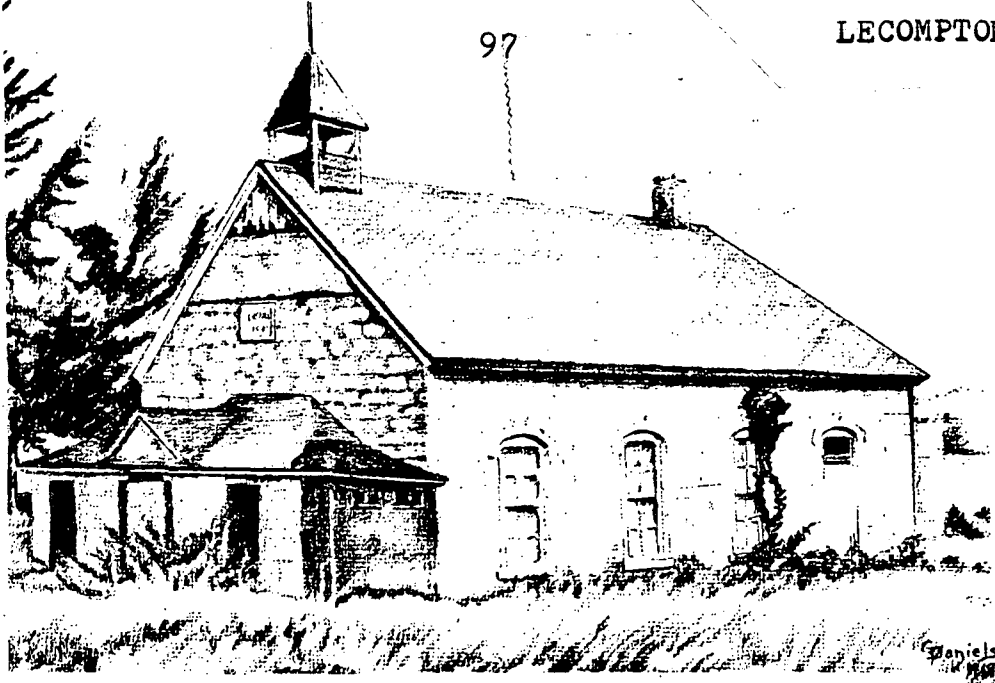
In infancy our subject was taken by his parents from Jefferson City, Mo., to Carthage, where the family remained a year, thence going to Preston. He accompanied his parents to Kansas, making the trip in a wagon which was drawn by a team of oxen and in which were placed all of the household effects. After settling in Douglas County he assisted his father in clearing a farm. At the time of his marriage he bought eighty-five acres, and there he resided until his father's death, since which time he has lived on the old homestead, and conducts both farms. While he is not a member of any denomination, he is in sympathy with the Methodist Episcopal Church. Active in politics as a Republican, he has served as delegate to various conventions and has kept posted concerning all public issues; had he so desired he might have held almost any local office, but his inclinations are not toward positions of prominence. He is interested in educational matters and has rendered excellent service as a member of the school board.

November 25, 1872, Mr. Ray married Anna McDonald, who was born and reared in La Porte, Ind., and was of Scotch descent. In the '70s she accompanied her parents to Kansas, and was married in Independence, this state. Later her parents removed to Florida. The oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Ray was George, who died at four years of age. Their other children are Ernest D., Nellie G. and Luke Elmer.

### GREENWOOD VALLEY NO. 24

The first school known of in what eventually became District No. 24, was located near the center of Sec. 1, T. 12, R. 17, on the Ben Kellogg place. Some distance northeast of Big Springs and a little over a half-mile south of the last school site, it was known as "The Old Stone School." This seemed to be the only name it ever had.

The writer has visited the spot and found the foundation half-buried in leaves but still clearly discernible, in a wooded and brushy area where deer now roam, but which a century ago was open rolling prairie.

Within the enclosure given by some as 24 by 30 feet, but which measures nearer 30 by 36 feet, lies a large block of dressed stone, and just outside a mound of stones covers what may have been an old well, now filled in as a safety measure.

It was built of native limestone with a dirt floor and probably faced south. Later the door was changed to the east, with a blackboard inside at the west end. The stove stood in the center of the room with benches arranged around the edges on which at one time, sat 65 pupils ranging in age from 5 to 25.

Two terms of three months each were held each year. Patrick Geelan, a school teacher, came to Big Springs from Ireland by way of New Jersey in 1855, and taught in this school for some time.

About 1873, "Cap" Nichols and Billy Duncan allotted one acre in the Southeast corner of the S. W. 1/4 of Sec. 36, T. 11, R. 17, for a new site on which a small frame schoolhouse to replace the old stone one, was built near the southwest corner of the plot, facing east.

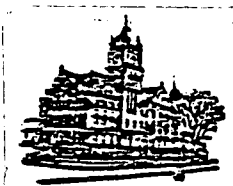
On the annual report of 1897-98, the clerk of the board, George M. Medsker, noted that \$51.00 had been received from the sale of the old frame schoolhouse.

This term ending in 1898 had two teachers, T. A. Crouch for twelve and four-fifths weeks and O. Bayles for fifteen and one-fifth weeks, with 56 pupils in attendance most of the time. The salary of each teacher was \$35.00 per month and total expenditure for the term was \$239.29. Board members were Wm. Glenn, Geo. M. Medsker and W. S. McClannahan.

The 67 of school age in the district at this time were: Cora, Willard, Frank and Maud BUNCE; Jessie and Helen BRADFORD; Henry BUSH; Volney and John CHRISTIAN; Myrtle CUMMINGS; Maud and Arthur COOK; Eliza, Willie and Charles DUNCAN; Jennie and Julia FINDLEY; Flora, Charles, Dora, Arthur, Clyde and Maggie GIBBENS; Charles, Bertha, Justus, Carrie and Nora GEELAN; Bessie GLENN; Theoph HOGUE; John HOGG; Jessie, Andrew and Frank HENNESSY; Clarence, Rolley, George, Louis, Lulu and Ruby JOHNSON; John, Fred, Moxie, Wesly, Henry and Dora KING; Maggie McCOLLUM; Goldie, Charlie and Laura MEDSGER; Fred, Minnie, Ethel and Mary McCLANNAHAN; Nellie, Warren, and Clarence MORRIS; Etta, Lee, Maud and Earl SHAFER; Bertha and Larnard TIMMENS; Cora and Reed SPENCER; Lena and William WEESE.

When the district was disorganized and consolidated with Lecompton No. 36, the schoolhouse and the acre on which it stands passed into possession of John Powell from whose farm the land originally had been taken. The large bell that once sounded through the valley, was stolen.

And as to my worldly estate and all the property real, personal or mixed of which I shall die seized and possessed as to which I shall be entitled at the time of my death & demise, bequeath and dispose thereof in the manner following to wit:

First. My will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall by my executors hereinafter named be paid out of my estate as soon after my death as shall by them be found convenient.

2<sup>nd</sup> Give devise and bequeath to my beloved brothers, Joseph BUNDLE and Leopold BUNDLE of Waldmossingen ab cline(?) obern Dorf Wierttenberg, my farm the west ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) half of South West ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) quarter of section (16) Sixteen in Township (14) fourteen of Range (18) eighteen East of 6" P.M. containg (80) eighty acres more or less in Douglas County Kansas and also all grains and products raised or growing (?) there an to which I am entitled at the time of my decease.

I lastly do nominate and appoint Mathias SIMON and Wesley FLORY to be the executors of this my last will and testament. In testamony where of I the said Bernhart BUNDLE have to this my last will and testament contained one sheat of paper subscribed myname and affixed my seal this 9th day of May A.D. 1891

January 23, 1876

Dear brother,

I seat myself to answer your kind and welcome letter which I received about two weeks ago. I thank you very much for that Christmas present. I got a veil & tye. The veil cost 35 cents and the necktye 65 cts. So it made two very nice presents. we are all well at present and hope this may find you the same. I started to write this letter last Tuesday & did not git it finished as I had company in the afternoon so I will try & finish today. I have not been well for two days & don't feel well today so if I dont write you a good letter you will have to excuse me. Eva & Jane J. were here the day I commenced this letter.

I had a letter from Ben. He seems to be enjoying himself very well this winter. He seems to do a great deal of blowing about his girl. I suppose she is a common (?) young lady. But you know what? She will do for anybody; I can tell. (It covers the faults.) One of the boys are coming home next month. They want to make some cuttings. Grape vines are very poor this winter. The grasshoppers made sad work of them. Mr. Louis Swanson has come back to his old home. Mr. Thomas Sturdy is working at Mr. Eill Gill of Coal Creek. Herb Davis is in the insane asylum in Wisconsin. He gets \$25 per month.

News to you: Fernealy Jones came home the other day with her husband. Dont you cry for there is just as good fish in the sea as ever was caught out. I see an account in the journal of Mr. Joseph Spangle marriage. He married Lide Price of Black Jack. John Dunn & his bride came home the day before New Years. They came in a wagon. Susie Campbell came with them. Edgar C. came home three weeks before they did. He came in the cars. Frank Nichols is working for a farmer in Michigan. Benton Andrews teaches our school this winter. He is liked very much by most of the folks. Will & George & Emma are going this winter. I will close for this time.

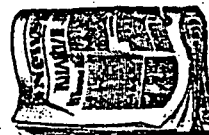

"Frederick SCHWARTZ came from Stuttgart, Wuerten burg Germany to America in 1857 with his brother, Charles, who was 21 years old. These two were the only two of five children to come, as the rest of the family stayed in Germany. Frederick settled in the Worden, Kansas area on what is now the Lester SCHWARTZ farm.

Frederick SCHWARTZ married Christene ROEBACHER. He left for the Civil War after news reached him while plowing. Leaving the plow in the field, he stopped only long enough to say good-bye to wife Christene. During his absence, Christene died while giving birth to daughter, Jennie. Jennie was cared for by Christene's parents.

When Frederick returned, he married Elizabeth PIPPERT. They had eight children: Albert, who died of typhoid at age 21, Louise, Henry, Lydia, Rose, Charles, Ella, and Carrie, who also died at age 21 of tuberculosis.

The homestead of Frederick SCHWARTZ is still visible on the SCHWARTZ farm. There is a one-room dugout for living quarters and a larger dug-out, which housed the animals. This is next to a beautiful, clear, cold-water spring. This farm was passed from Frederick to son Charles, then to his son, Lester and is now farmed by his son, Don, and grandsons, Greg and Scot.

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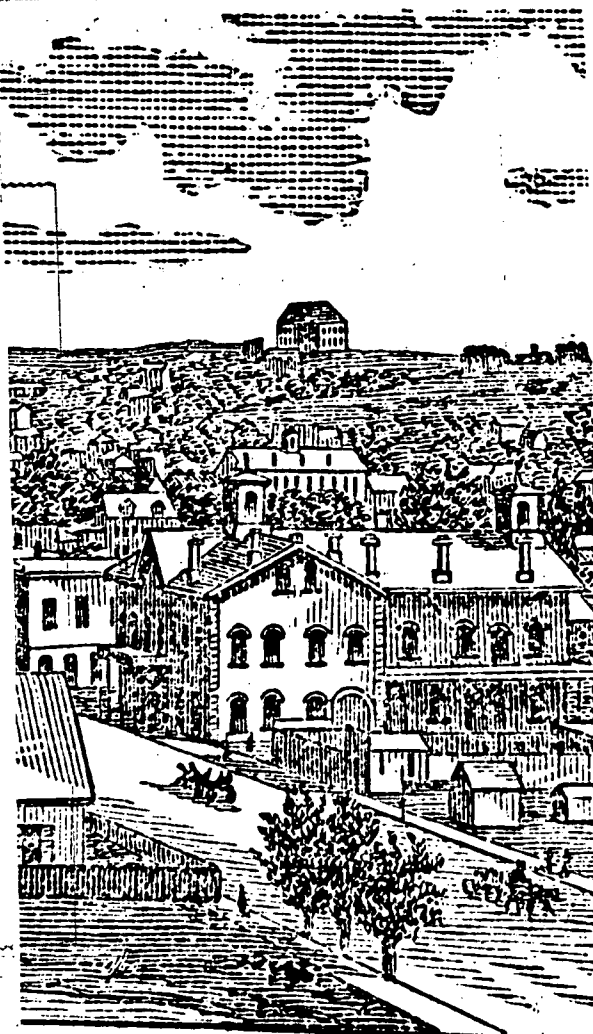
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"Vermont Street, Lawrence, Kansas ca. 1880"
