Andrew Carnegie Makes a Tender of \$25,000, for University Town

Lawrence has an offer of a library from Andrew Carnegie, as the following letter indicates:

Topeka, Kansas, June 16, 1902. —

To the Mayor and Council of the City of Lawrence, Kansas.

Gentlemen:—I am authorized to say that Mr. Andrew Carnegie will give your city \$25,000 for a public free library building provided the council adopts a resolution obligating the city to appropriate for the care and maintenance of the library not less than \$2,500 annually and provided further that a suitable site is given by the city. On receipt of the resolution named, with information as to the proposed site, I will transmit same to Mr. Carnegie. He will indicate how he desires the matter to proceed. Yours truly,
