

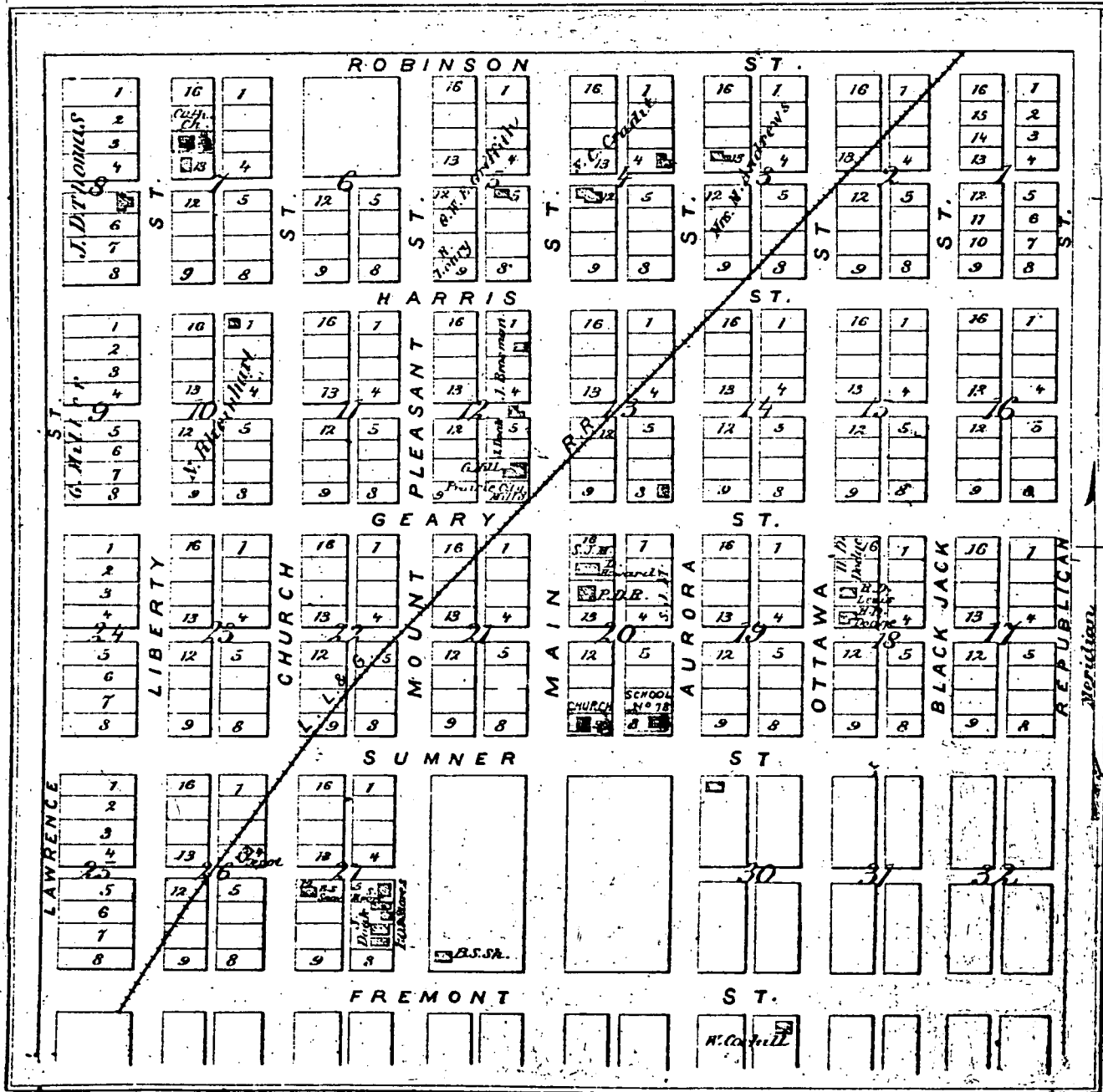

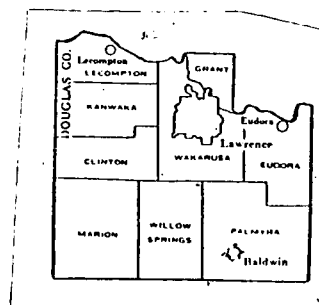

They are taken from the Bible of her great-grandparents, Lycurgus and Sarah Caroline MATTHEWS RHODES who lived and died in Lawrence, Kansas. Lycurgus RHODES was born in Hanoverton, Ohio in 1819 and his wife, Sarah Caroline MATTHEWS was born in Morgantown, West Virginia in 1839. Their daughter Lillian Iona RHODES, from whom Mrs. Whipple traces her descent was born in Noble Co., Ohio in 1870. The Bible is in the possession of Mrs. (Wm.) Dorothy COX CORCORAN. The Title page reads as follows: The Holy Bible, International Bible Agency, 150 Fifth Avenue, New York, and The Christian Herald, Louis Klopsch, Proprietor, 92 Bible House, New York. DIVORCE RECORDS: Unexpected Genealogical Treasure

Little did we suspect what was in store for us when Pauline ELNIFF and I decided one day last fall to undertake the task of abstracting early Douglas County divorce records. In the first place, we did not realize what an immense project it would be. There being no index solely for divorce cases, it was first necessary to sift through the Index of Civil cases located at Spencer Research Library on the University of Kansas campus where many of the older court records are kept. We were looking for cases in which both plaintiff and defendant had the same surname. Then, armed with names, case numbers and our natural curiosity, it was down to the storage basement at the Judicial and Law Enforcement Building where the old case files of Civil and Criminal cases are stored in metal cabinets. Some of the files had surely not been opened since they were placed there a century or more ago judging from the amount of dust on them.

As we read each case, we were struck with the poignancy of particular stories, amazed at the contemporary nature of others, but mainly surprised by the wealth of genealogical information available. After reading numerous cases, we came to the conclusion that divorce records are probably the most misunderstood and least utilized records available to genealogists. Why? Because we do not usually even consider that one of our ancestors may have been divorced.

Just think about your own family tree. Situation I: Your great-grandmother married your great-grandfather and lived together happily until death did them part. You have seen their marriage certificate which shows your great-grandmother's maiden name. There is nothing to make you suspect that she may have been previously married and divorced. So, "Why check divorce records?" Answer: Our experience reading early Douglas County divorce cases has taught us that many of the women married first using their maiden name, got a divorce and a return of their maiden name, and married someone else using their maiden name again! (Some women, on the other hand, requested that the surname of their first husband be restored to them at the time of divorce from their second husband). Moral: Check divorce records in your ancestor's county just in case there was a previous marriage and divorce.

Situation II: You know that one of your great-grandfathers was married twice, but you and your family have always assumed that his first wife died shortly after marriage and he then remarried. So, "Why check divorce records?" Answer: You may find as we did that many men were married a first time, divorced a year or two later, and then remarried in a year or so to someone else. Even though some of the divorced men's biographical sketches in a county history revealed a first wife in some instances, there was no mention that he was divorced from her, leaving descendants to assume that the first wife died. Moral: Check divorce records, be skeptical of family traditions and "read between the lines" of biographical sketches.

Situation III: You are absolutely sure that there are no divorces in your family, so "Why check early divorce records?" Answer: While it may be true that you are unlikely to find an ancestor who was divorced, it is quite probable that one or more of your ancestors may have been subpoenaed in a divorce case as witness for either the plaintiff or defendant. If so, your ancestor's deposition may give innumerable facts about himself and other relatives. Moral: Check early divorce records for possible mention of your ancestor no matter from what social level he came. We found depositions of witnesses from every economic and social level of the community in the Douglas County divorce records.

NOW...If we have convinced you to consider checking divorce records, here are some of the treasures which may await you:

Name of the plaintiff and defendant; the date and place of their marriage; wife's maiden name; children's names and ages; grounds for the divorce (if adultery-sometimes giving the name of the other person involved), (if bigamy-sometimes giving name and marriage date of first spouse), (if cruelty or neglect-sometimes giving dates and places of incidents of physical or verbal abuse); military service; sometimes real and personal property, occupations, ages, names of other relatives; letters or other papers in defendant's own writing answering allegations; newspaper notices of the pending divorce; names of sheriffs and other officials; and many other items of interest relating to customs of the times and local history.

In one touching letter from a soon-to-be divorced woman of Douglas County to the Clerk of Court in 1864, we read the following:

"...if it must be so i will give him a bill of divorce, but would rather live and enjoy life happily with him than do so and if there is any mercy in heaven and justice in law i hope i shall receive my just dues."

Below we begin the first installment of Abstracts of Divorces in Douglas County, 1864-1884. Due to shortages of staff in the office of the Clerk of the District Court able to do research of a genealogical nature, it is suggested that the Douglas County Genealogical Society be contacted if further information is needed from the case files.

The Office of the Comptroller of the Currency, Department of Treasury in Washington, DC has the remains of the unclaimed contents of thousands of safe deposit boxes from National Banks which failed during the Depression. The unclaimed property includes such items as old wills, and other papers of genealogical importance, jewelry, coins and other items normally kept in safe deposit boxes.

A listing of the 23,000 persons and organizations who were named as the last owners of the property was published in the June 29, 1983 issue of The Federal Register. The names are listed alphabetically by the state where the bank was located. To file a claim it is necessary to complete an OCC claims form which is available from: The Office of the Comptroller of the Currency

All claims must be filed by June of 1984 or the property will be destroyed. 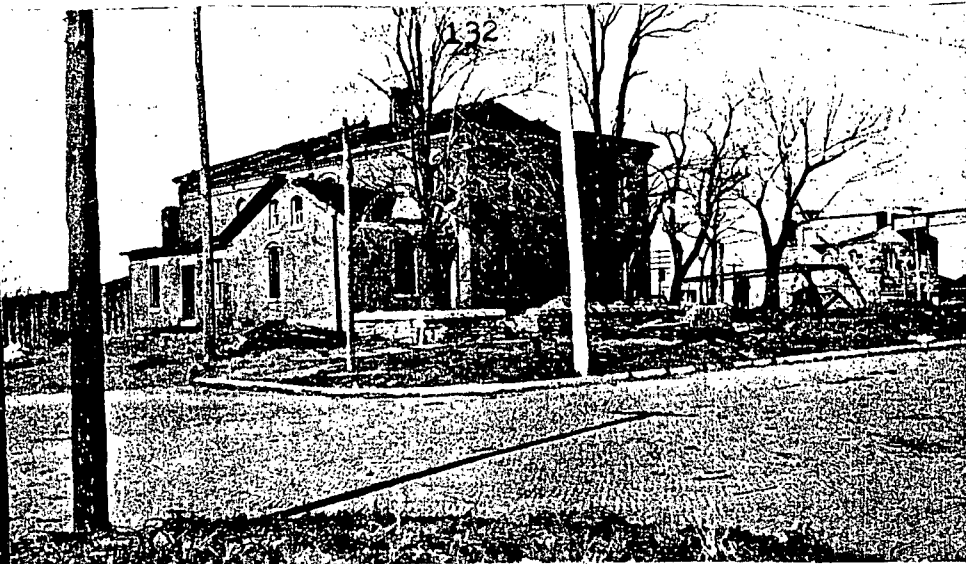

Present

The Old Lawrence Jail, no longer in existence, was located on the north side of present-day 6th street, between Vermont and Massachusetts streets in Lawrence. Note the bridge to the right of the jail and the Bowerstock Mill to the right of the bridge. This photo was taken shortly after the 1911 tornado. The earliest jail in Lawrence was a 20 X 20 foot log structure built in 1858. County commissioners, Josiah MILLER and William BARRICKLOW were instrumental in securing funds with which to build the log jail.

In 1860 the jail in the picture above was built west of Robinson park and was the first iron jail in Kansas. According to an article in the Journal World dated Oct 7 1937, the iron with which the jail was constructed was put on the steamboat, "Izetta" enroute to Lawrence but the "Izetta" became stuck on a sand bar at De Soto and the iron had to be unloaded and brought the rest of the way by wagons.

According to the Republican Journal, Lawrence, KS, Apr 27 1871 issue, a reporter who visited the jail in April of 1871 described a cell on the NE corner of the 2nd floor as "dirty and squalid". Although the cell did contain a chair and desk, the mattress was described as being only one inch in thickness. Some of the prisoners whom the reporter saw on his visit were: Dr. John MEDLICOTT, charged with the murder of Mr. I.M. RUTH; "the notorious 'Cinda, Alex MONTGOMERY; SPRIGGS, the crazy man; a Polish lunatic; two vagrants, one petty larceny (six months) and one attempt to kill (six months)."

The Douglas County courthouse was built in 1903 on the S.E. corner of Massachusetts and 11th St. A few years later the jail was located in a building E. of the courthouse where it remained until the construction of the new Judicial and Law Enforcement Building adjacent to South Park in 1976.

On the following pages are the names of those persons listed in the Criminal Appearance Docket Book I (1863-1878). Much information can be gleaned from the actual files which are stored in the basement of the Judicial and Law Enforcement Building. Due to shortages of staff in the District Court Office able to do research of this nature, it is suggested that interested persons contact the DCGS if further information is needed from the case files.

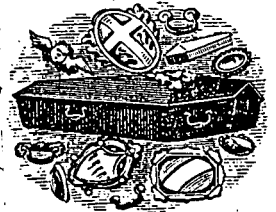

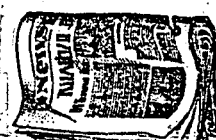

The Lawrence Journal World, Nov 22, 1983 issue reported the efforts of Amelia BETTS of Baldwin City, KS to restore seven monuments along the Santa Fe Trail in Douglas Co. The monuments were erected by the Daughters of the American Revolution in 1906 and 1907. Some of the monuments are now in poor condition due to erosion and other factors. Miss BETTS believes that without some outside help, the monuments may further deteriorate.

Miss BETTS and Katharine KELLEY are in the process of restoring two of the monuments, one honoring the former town of PALMYRA and the other about one half mile north of BALDWIN CITY. The others in need of restoration are at the sites of: GLOBE, BLACK JACK, BROOKLYN, WILLOW SPRINGS, and FLAG SPRINGS. The one that needs the most work is at BROOKLYN. "It is just a wooden sign that says "BROOKLYN"". The sign has no foundation.

Miss BETTS feels that if something is not done soon to restore these markers, future generations may not even know the whereabouts of such places as the long-extinct towns of BROOKLYN and WILLOW SPRINGS. She would welcome financial or other kinds of help in continuing her goal of restoring all seven of the Douglas County markers. PORTRAIT AND BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD.

of LEAVENWORTH, DOUGLAS and FRANKLIN COUNTIES, KANSAS, 1899



WILLIAM GARDNER, deceased, who was one of the pioneers of Hesper, Douglas County, was born in Guilford County, N. C., January 19, 1807, a son of Thaddeus and Eunice (Starbuck) Gardner, both of whom were natives of Nantucket Island. Growing to manhood in his native place, he early learned lessons of self-reliance, industry and perseverance, which stood him in good stead during the vicissitudes of an active life. It was difficult for him to gain a substantial footing in the south, where the surroundings and conditions were such as to prevent prosperity. At the opening of the Civil war, in 1861, he removed to Kansas and purchased one hundred and sixty acres of land near the present village of Hesper, in Eudora Township, Douglas County. Here, busily engaged in agricultural pursuits, he passed the remaining years of his life, and here death came to him, in 1881, at the age of seventy-three years.

By birth and training Mr. Gardner was a member of the Friends' Church. In character he possessed those attributes usually noticeable in members of that sect, being modest, unassuming, strictly honest and peace-loving. When Quantrell made his famous raid to Lawrence he passed Mr. Gardner's home and killed a man one mile west, but he said that, while he would like to have another man he did not wish to disturb a people so peaceful as that of the Quakers. The fact that his religious views prevented him from taking part in the Civil war did not prevent Mr. Gardner from supporting the cause of the Union in such other ways as were possible. Believing that slavery should not exist he removed from the south, although by doing so he sacrificed almost all of his property and the mercantile business which he conducted at Florence, N. C. While living in the south, May 6, 1841, he married Miss Penelope Hill, a native of North Carolina, and who is still living. She is a lady of gentle demeanor, with a heart full of kindness toward the suffering and distressed and a ready sympathy that wins friends among her acquaintances.



WINSLOW DAVIS. During the period of his residence in Eudora Township, which covered twenty-three years, Mr. Davis won and retained a high position among his fellow-citizens, and became known as one of the honorable, industrious farmers of Douglas County. He was born in Randolph County, N. C., in 1813, a son of James and Caroline (Winslow) Davis, both natives of North Carolina. When a boy he received fair advantages and for a time, in early manhood, he engaged in teaching school. However, agriculture was his occupation throughout the greater period of his life.

At the opening of the Civil war Mr. Davis, finding surroundings unpleasant in the south, determined to settle in Kansas. Accompanied by his wife and two children they had adopted he made the trip, overland, from Guilford County, N. C., to Douglas County, Kans. After a long and weary journey, which was made in a covered wagon, he finally arrived at his destination, and settled near what is now Hesper, on an eighty-acre tract. At the same time he entered a quarter-section in Chase County and another quarter in Lyon County, but made his home in Douglas County, where he followed general farming.

For many years Mr. Davis was a prominent worker in the Society of Friends, in which he long officiated as an elder. At the time of the building of Hesper Academy he was one of the most liberal contributors to the movement. His life was unmarked by great changes or adventurous incidents. He pursued the quiet, even tenor of his way as a peace-loving Quaker, striving in word and deed to exemplify the teachings of that sect, and in its faith he passed away, in 1884, at the age of seventy-one years. He had been married in 1837 to Margaret Hill, who, since his death, has resided in the home that she built at Hesper, with her sister, Mrs. Gardner.

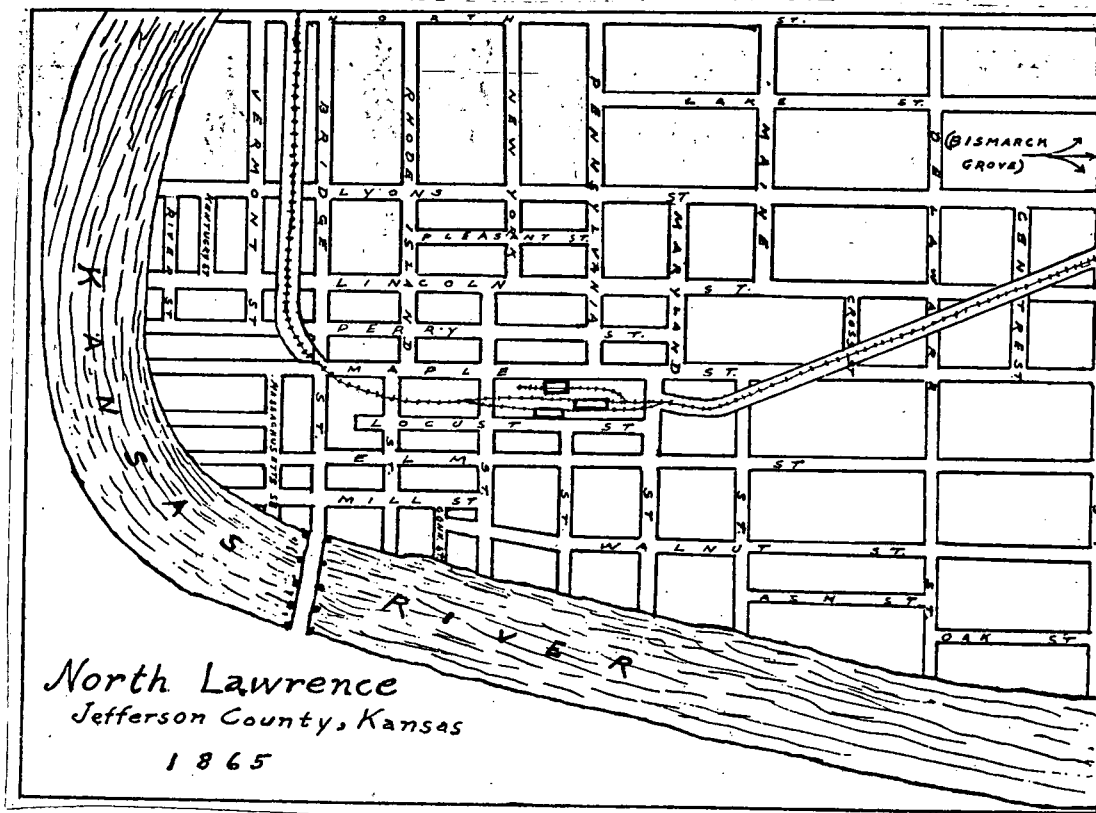
EARLY BUSINESSES IN NORTH LAWRENCE

The following information was taken from the booklet entitled, EARLY HISTORY of NORTH LAWRENCE, published by the Woodlawn Parent Teachers Association in 1961, A.B. Ewing, Author.

"Among the first settlers north of the river were: John MOREHEAD, a Kentuckian, who opened the first trader's store...C.F. SAUM, a carpenter from Ohio; Thomas McCAGE, a merchant from New York; O.H. MITCHELL, a carpenter; M.H. BERRY, who operated a bowling alley; Isaac TIBBETS, a grocer"...and others. "The 1860's found the area copiously served by many small shops and stores to meet the more immediate needs of the residents. The principal business streets were Bridge Street and Locust Street."

"The largest store was DICKER's on the corner of Locust and North Seventh Streets. Here you could buy almost anything from groceries to harness. HISLOP's Grocery was on the southeast corner of North Fifth and Lyons Streets. WIEDMAN's Grocery was located at Lake Street and North Seventh Street. O.M. SEARLES operated his barber shop on Bridge Street. A.L. CAREY operated a grocery store on Bridge Street, across the street from the present location of the Union Pacific Freight Depot. " On the NE corner of Locust and North Seventh Streets John SHIELDS operated a meat market. On the SE corner of Locust and North Fifth Streets was the LINDLEY's Drug Store.

When Quantrill's party raided Lawrence in August of 1863 burning most of the business section and many of the residences of Lawrence, as far as is known, no buildings were burned in North Lawrence, "although members of Quantrill's party did ford the river to forage food and fresh horses".

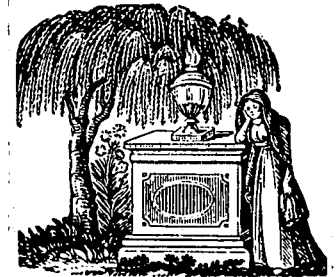

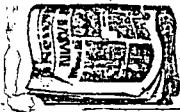

John A. WAKEFIELD-The funeral of Judge John A. WAKEFIELD occurred
yesterday, from his late residence on Penn. st. the services being
conducted by Rev. W. K. MARSHALL, of the Methodist Church...Judge
WAKEFIELD came to Kansas from Minnesota,..prior to that had lived in
Illinois where he took an active part in the Black Hawk War...On
arrival in the Territory of Kansas, he proceeded to a point in
Kanwaka township on the California road, 7 miles W. of Lawrence. It
was in those days a Free-State Outpost on the borders of the border
ruffian territory...Accordingly, Judge WAKEFIELD, who was an un-
compromising Free-State man from the first, was burned out by the
enemy in 1856. Nothing daunted, he built another house and held his
ground...he set a large orchard which he lived to see bear fruit
year after year...He was temporary chairman of the Topeka Constitu-
tional convention and was elected State Treasurer under that constitu-
tion. A few years (ago) he sold the valuable farm he had won from
the wilderness and has since resided in Lawrence. His health has
been feeble for some months. He was a good man and true.

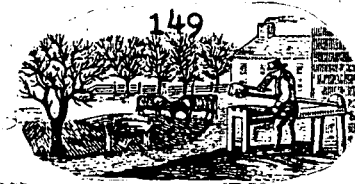

Extracts from the Biographical Sketch of

FRANCIS M. JENKINS

as found in PORTRAIT and BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD of LEAVENWORTH,
DOUGLAS and FRANKLIN COUNTIES, KANSAS, 1899

Francis M. JENKINS, a veteran of the Civil war and a farmer of Marion Township, Douglas County, was born in Rappahannock County, VA, January 15, 1833, a son of Newman and Maria (WEEKLY) JENKINS of whose twelve children eight survive. They are: Harrison, Francis, Nancy, Mary, Elizabeth, Margaret, Washington, and William.

The JENKINS family was established in Virginia in a very early day. Newman JENKINS was born in Rappahannock Co. where he married and settled upon a farm. In 1837, he moved to Ohio and established a home in Licking Co. Later he moved to adjoining counties and died in Mercer Co. at the age of 72. His father was Timothy JENKINS, born in Rappahannock Co. and his father-in-law was Frank WEEKLY, a native of Virginia who served in the War of 1812 and died at the age of 115.

Francis M. JENKINS attended subscription schools in his early years and in 1855 left his parents home and became a farm hand in different parts of Ohio. In 1856, he married Miss Mary C. SAFFLE, who was born in Muskingum Co., Ohio, a daughter of Thomas and Louise (SHAW) SAFFLE. Her father was a native of Virginia.

After marriage, Francis JENKINS purchased a farm of forty acres in Muskingum Co. where he settled down to agricultural pursuits. On May 2, 1864 he enlisted in Company E, 160th Ohio Infantry and was sent with his command to the front, doing service in the Shenandoah Valley. He took part in the engagements at Middletown and Harper's Ferry, besides numerous skirmishes. He was mustered out at Zanesville, Ohio, September 7, 1864.

In the fall of 1865, Mr. JENKINS moved to Moultrie Co., Illinois and one year later came to Kansas, arriving in Douglas County on November 27, 1866. While living in Illinois he had traded for his present farm in Marion Township, and here he has since engaged in general farming. Since 1858, he has been a member of the Methodist Church. Believing thoroughly in public schools, he has done all in his power to advance the schools in his district, and for many years rendered efficient service as treasurer of the school board. In politics he is a Republican. Since 1870, he has been a member of the Masonic blue lodge, and is also connected with Richland Post No. 370, G.A.R.

Of the seven children born to the union of Mr. and Mrs. JENKINS, five are living, namely: Hiram, who cultivates the home farm; Louise, wife of M.T. HARDING, a farmer of Douglas County; Salome, who married Sanford OWENS, a farmer of Osage County, Kansas; Carrie, wife of Edward DODDER, a farmer of Osage County; and Mary, who married Jacob WRIGHT and also makes her home in Osage County.



Prairie City

PRAIRIE CITY, now extinct, was located one mile S.W. of Baldwin City, KS in Palmyra Township. It was not a "paper city" as were many of the other early names on the map, but a real town with houses, stores, churches and even a newspaper, The Freeman's Champion.

In 1856, a school for boys called the Heber Institute was begun in the area and in 1857 a Roman Catholic Mission was established nearby. Most of the church's members were from France and Ireland.

Some of the first settlers in PRAIRIE CITY were: Charles BUTEL, Francis Celestine JARDON and his three oldest sons, Auguste JAQUOT, Henry STEVENIN, Pascal AVRIL, the BAYSINGER's, Nehemiah GREEN, Helen HARRIS, W. SOWERS, H. GRIFFEN, John DEERING and many others. James LANE was the founder of PRAIRIE CITY and it was incorporated on 4 Feb 1859.

In the Kansas State Historical Society Collections, Vol 15, p. 407, there is a reference to PRAIRIE CITY's being laid out by "certain citizens of Louisville, (KY)". One hundred families left Louisville for PRAIRIE CITY about June 1, 1856 according to the Louisville Journal, May 16, 1856 issue.

Apparently there were quite a few PRAIRIE CITY residents from Aurora, IL judging by the mention of that town in marriage and death notices in The Freeman's Champion. One of PRAIRIE CITY's streets was even named "Aurora".

It was in PRAIRIE CITY that Horace GREELEY made a speech to 400 people at a Republican gathering on June 19, 1859. Soon after his visit to Kansas, he made his famous statement, "Go West, Young Man".

In a publication of the Santa Fe Trail Historical Society, Baldwin City, KS, entitled "Where Was Prairie City?", 1855-1883", Vol. 1, a description is given of what remained of PRAIRIE CITY in 1972: "The cemeteries, the railroad, the pump and well on what was Eden Park, the ruins of the Catholic Mission on Liberty Hill, the abandoned school house and the two-story stone house (the C.N. and Mary MOWRER residence) which at one time was a general store and inn, and lots of stone and other evidence of buildings" is all that remains of the town of PRAIRIE CITY.

On the inside cover of this issue we show a plat map of PRAIRIE CITY as it appeared in the 1873 Atlas of Douglas Co., Ks by F.W. BEERS. A copy of a portion of a page from The Freeman's Champion, dated 8 July 1858 is printed on the inside back cover of this issue.

On the following pages we give excerpts of interest from The Freeman's Champion, which was established by S.S. PROUTY in June of 1857 in a tent erected by the ladies for that use. The Kansas State Historical Society has a complete file of The Freeman's Champion in their newspaper room.

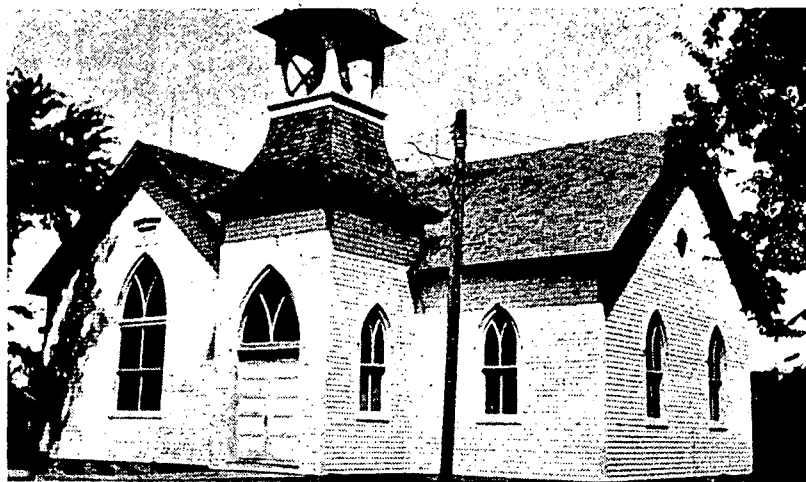

WORDEN UNITED METHODIST CHURCH
CELEBRATING IT'S 115th ANNIVERSARY



The First Church — Built In 1872

The following information was taken from the booklet, The Worden United Methodist Church 100th Anniversary and from the church bulletin, Word from Worden, Feb. 1984, Vol 3, #2.

"Nearly all of the free state settlers were church members in communities from which they came, and one of the first provision they made after settling in the Territory was for religious services. At first, services were held in the open air, in rented rooms, in tents or in

rude cabins. But as settlement increased, church buildings were erected."

"While serving in the Lawrence Circuit in 1869, S.W. McKESSON preached in a school house and organized Willow Springs. The following were charter members: Charles WARNER and wife, Rev. D.R. ZELLNER and wife, Conrad PIPPERT and wife, Daniel HEFFNER and wife, Mother PIPPERT, Mother FAGER, Mrs. G. OEHRLE and C.LONG and wife."

In 1872 the first church was built on land given by Henry FAGER. The structure was wooden and it measured 28 X 40 feet. Some of the Ministers in the First church were: S.W. McKESSON, H. HAAS, John WUERTH, J.F. SCHRIEBER, P. FRICKER, C. EMMEL and others.

In 1874 a Sunday School was organized with Conrad PIPPERT as Superintendent. "Worden was originally part of the Lawrence Mission." In 1885 Lawrence Circuit was changed to Eudora Circuit. "The Willow Springs appointment continued as part of the Eudora Circuit until 1906 when it was detached and formed into Worden Mission. A parsonage was built in 1900."

When improvements were made on Highway 50 N. the old Worden church was taken down, the last service being held there on September 11 1932. A new church was begun and was dedicated February 5, 1933. This month the Worden United Methodist Church is celebrating it's 115th Anniversary. On February 5, 1984 the church basement is to be rededicated and named "Friendship Hall".
