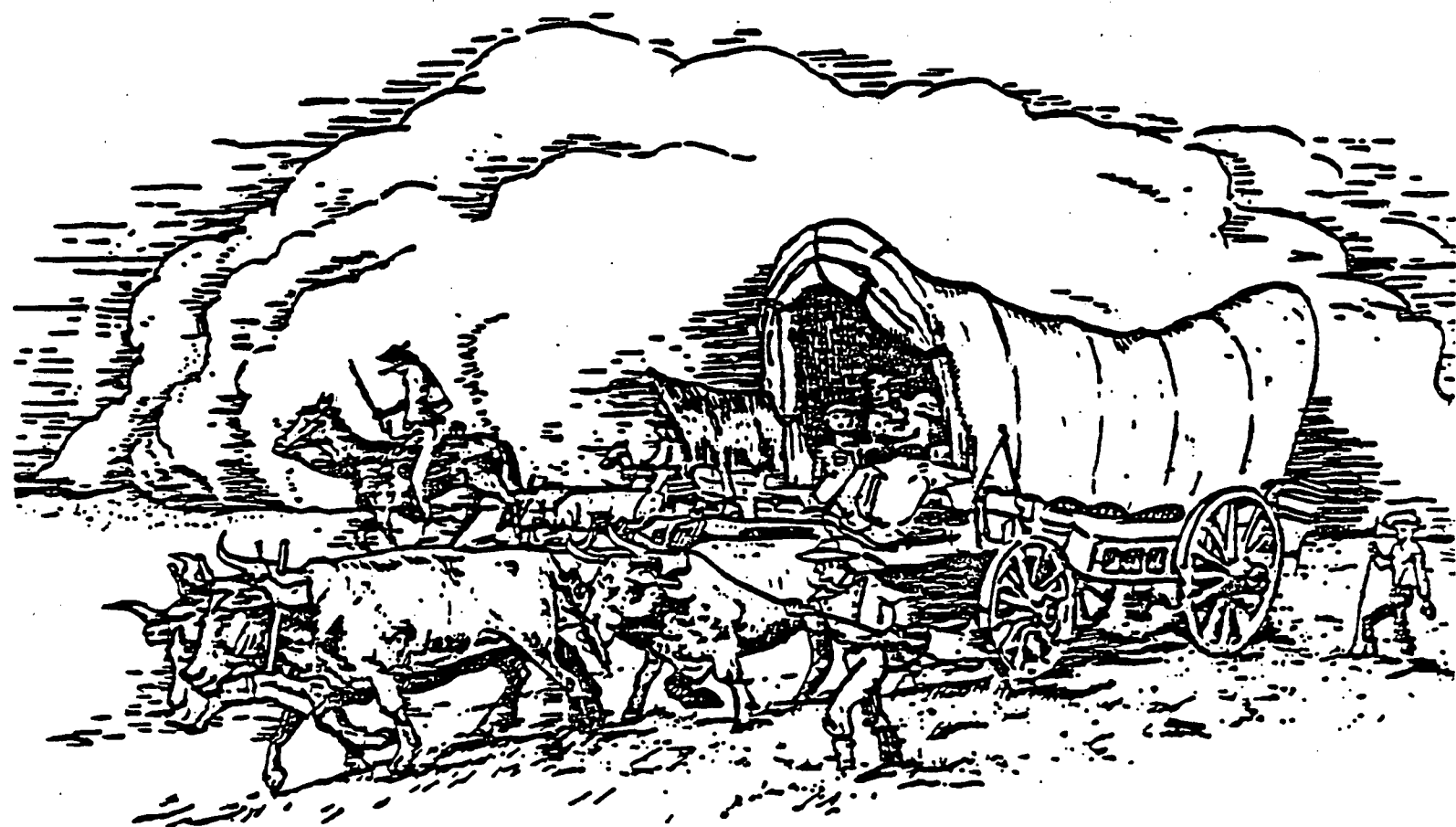

THE ANCESTORS, FAMILY AND DESCENDANTS OF  
JOHANN HENRICH LUDWIG THOREN AND CATHARINA SOPHIA BECKMEIR  
FROM 1630 TO 1984

This is a loose bound volume of 135 pages compiled by Mrs. Elizabeth HAYNES of Santa Rosa, CA. As any useful genealogy should be, the volume is indexed.

Mrs. HAYNES documents the ancestors of Mr. THOREN and his wife Catharina BECKMEIR back to the 1600's. Pictures and a description of the Brakelsick, Germany area are included which was the birthplace of the couple. An interesting bit of information Mrs. HAYNES mentions is children took the name of the mother on occasion as in the event a woman became a widow and remarried. The new husband took the name of the farm.

The THORENS came to America and settled in Stephanson County, Illinois. Most of the seven children stayed in Illinois or nearby states.

Of special interest to those with family in Douglas County, Kansas, is the section on Henrich Christian THOREN and Katharina Elizabeth ROHRBACH. The couple came to Eudora, Kansas in its very early years. They raised a large family and most of their descendants are listed. A few of the families in Douglas County are THOREN, NEIS, GERSTENBERGER, ALTENBERND, FLEMING, GABRIEL and DURR.

In the more recent families many dates of births, deaths and marriages are given.

## Death Notices in Newspapers

(Jan 1861-Oct 1863)

The following death-notices were copied from the following newspapers: Lawrence Republican through Nov 1862 only)--"LR"; Kansas State Journal, (through 13 Aug 1863, followed by the first issue after Quantrill's Raid of Lawrence dated 1 Oct 1863)--"KSJ"; and Lecompton National Democrat--"L Nat Dem".

- ALLEN, J. Samuel, about 18, colored, drowned on Saturday afternoon in river at this place while bathing. Found about 1½ miles from the city. LR, 19 Jun 1862, p. 3.
- ALLEN, Jessie, 7 mos. 28 days, adopted daughter of Lyman and Jeanette ALLEN, died in this city on 8th inst. of dysentery. KSJ, 27 Jun 1861, p. 3.
- ALLEN, Nettie, 10 mos. 21 days, youngest child of Elmore and Ann L. ALLEN, died 29 ult in Lawrence, from dropsy. LR, 2 Oct 1862, p. 3. Also KSJ, 2 Oct 1862, p. 3. "died 29th inst."
- ALLEN, Norman (Capt.), born Alleghany Co., NY, 2 May 1830, came to Missouri as early as 1852, came to Lawrence in 1854, died on 8th inst. in St. Louis. (Long obituary). KSJ, 16 Jul 1863, p. 2.
- ANDERSON, \_\_\_\_\_, shot by Judge A.I. Baker near Council Grove on Monday last in self-defense. KSJ, 15 May 1862, p. 3.
- ANGELL, R.C., of Co. K of Kansas 1st Reg., killed at Battle of Springfield. LR, 22 Aug 1861, p. 2.
- BABCOCK, Lt. Horatio, of 31st N.Y. Vols, brother of C.W. Babcock of Lawrence, and O.E. Babcock, died. Had been wounded at Battle of West Point, VA. Was born Franklin Co., VT. (From the Leavenworth Conservative.) LR, 12 Jun 1862, p. 2. Also, KSJ, 29 May 1862, p. 3. "Wounded on 7th May, survived 24 hours."
- BACON, Mr. \_\_\_\_\_, citizen of Atchison Co, found murdered, Mon, 17th inst. KSJ, Thurs., 27 Nov 1862, p. 3.
- BAILEY, James G., killed by Indian arrows about 15th Aug. while encamped on Greene River some 80 miles N. of Salt Lake City. He was in a party of emigrants from this Co. for Salmon River. He leaves large family at Rising Sun, just opposite Lecompton. KSJ, 16 Oct 1862, p. 3.
- BAKER, Judge A.I., murdered in revenge for death of Anderson on Santa Fe Road on 31st July (?) by Quantrell's men. From Emporia News. LR, 10 Jul 1862, p. 2. Also, KSJ, 10 Jul 1862, p. 3. "killed by pistols, on Thurs. evening, 3 Jul. Brother-in-law SEGUR also killed. From Emporia News."
- BALDWIN, James, a proprietor of Lawrence Ferry, died Thurs. 29th ult. from injuries. He was returning from trip to Leavenworth, near the Little Strange (Creek?), thrown from horse. He had a brother, Lt. Moses Baldwin. Was buried Friday last, leaves young wife. Funeral sermon next sabbath 11:00 by Elder Veatch.
- BANKS, Hiram B., about 30, brother of Maj. Gen. Banks, killed in one of late battles in Virginia. Connected with Boston press, subsequently resided in Connecticut a prominent orator. LR, 18 Sep 1862, p. 3.
- BARBER, Thomas, age 78 yrs; 2 mos. 1 day, died at residence of his son, Oliver Barber, native of Pennsylvania, in Ohio 13 years, came to Kansas spring of 1855 with son, Thomas W. Barber, who was killed in troubles of that year. LR, 14 Feb 1861, p. 3.

BARKER, Dr. Francis, 56 years, died at his residence near this city, of congestion of lungs, Sunday, 1st inst. 8 o'clock P.M. Resident of KS 25 yrs., 18 yrs. missionary with the Shawnee Indians, member of Baptist Church. LR (?) 5 Feb 1863.

BASSETT, Mrs. Susan M., 65 yrs, died near Lecompton on 18th inst. of pneumonia. "Boston papers please copy". LR, 27 Mar 1862, p. 3. Also, KSJ, 27 Mar 1862, p. 3, says "died 15th inst."

BATES, \_\_\_\_\_, shot with Jack Shelton at Bullcreek. "a short time since". From Conservative, LR, 9 Oct 1862, p. 2.

BEATLEY, \_\_\_\_\_, shot by \_\_\_\_\_ Motler (or Motter?) at Big Sandy Station, 50 miles west of Marysville on Sunday 11th. KSJ, 29 May 1862, p. 3.

BETTS, Wilson, formerly of Mahaska Co., IN, died at Springfield 22 Aug. Wounded at Battle of Wilson's Creek, 10 Aug. Member of Co "F", 2nd KS Vol. joined Co. Mansfield, Linn Co. "His effects consisted of Bible, coats, blankets, etc. in my possession." Signed Capt. B.P. Ayers, 2nd KS Vol. "Iowa papers please copy." LR 5 Sep 1861, p. 3.

BEWLEY, Rev. Anthony, a martyr for religion and liberty. (No date of death given). Funeral sermon by Rev. W.R. Davis, D.D. in College Building, Baldwin City. LR, 22 Aug 1861, p. 3.

BIGNER, Mrs. \_\_\_\_\_, wife of Maj. Bigner of 13th WI Reg., died at Eldridge House, yesterday morning. Mr. Bigner is returning with her body to Wisconsin for interment. KSJ, 3 Apr 1862, p. 3.

BIRD, Geo. (Family), parents and children burned to death at Pullin's Corners, Wayne Co., MO, Sat. last by kerosene oil can explosion. LR, 10 Jul 1862, p. 3.

BLISS, Mr. \_\_\_\_\_, citizen of Weston, MO, bitten by a small dog, died of rabies, Monday evening. KSJ, 28 Aug 1862, p.3.

"Black Hawk", half-breed Pottawatomie Indian, stabbed last Mon. even. by the mill in Topeka by Isaac Edwards, died next day. LR, 28 Mar 1861, p. 2.

BLANCHARD, A. Judson, age 30, of N.Y. City, formerly of Lawrence, KS, died 23rd Sep at Hollister, MA. KSJ, 13 Nov 1862, p. 3.

BRANCH, Stephen, hung with Jack Dixon by a band of unknown men at encampment crossing of Big Blue river about 4 miles above Manhattan, while they were prisoners. (From Manhattan Express, 4th inst). KSJ 16 Oct 1862, p. 1.

BRANSCOMB, Thomas, of DeKalb Co., MO, private, Co. "H" 1st Reg. Cal. Mo. State militia, drowned while bathing in Missouri river at Leavenworth. KSJ, 28 Aug 1862, p. 3.

BROADHEAD, Ellen A., age 25, wife of Hon. J.F. Broadhead of Mound City, died in Mound City. Born in N.Y. "western papers please copy." KSJ, 18 Jul 1861, p. 3.

BRONSON, John L., in 31st year, died Thursday, 4 September of congestion of brain. Born Baltimore, but parents soon moved to Fall River, MA. In 1848 he came West with brother and spent 2 years in IL, IA, and other points on Mississippi, returned to Fall River and went into business. 1853-went to Ca. for 3 years, returned and married, his wife going back with him on journey out. They escaped serious injury in railroad accident on the isthamus, on return, small pox on board the steamer, left for two weeks in Panama. 1857, came to KS, was building a dwelling. LR, 11 Sep 1862, p. 3.



BROWN, Elmore Ellsworth, 1 year 3 mos. 22 days, youngest son of William and Jane S. Brown, died in this city, Wednesday eve. 9th inst. LR, 10 Jul 1862, p. 3.

BROWN, Garwood H., 29 years, formerly of Durham, Green Co., NY, died at Lecompton Friday, 9th May 1862 after a short illness. KSJ, 15 May 1862, p. 3.

BROWN, William, a Baptist minister of Linn Co., and a member of Capt. Jen-nison's Co., found dead last Monday in a ravine just east of town, Apparently shot himself with a Colt's revolver. LR, 13 Jun 1861, p. 3. Also, KSJ, 13 Jun 1861, p. 3. "found in a ravine about 25 rods from Guest's saw mill in this city. Had resided in MO. four to five years before coming to KS. A resident of Linn Co., KS for past four years. Age about 30. Wounded by Colt revolver, found by Mr. Rodell, a workman at mill. Remains interred in Lawrence cemetery."

BUCKINGHAM, Hon. Joseph Tinker, oldest printer and journalist in MA, died at his residence in Cambridge. Thursday, 15 Apr, age 81 yrs 3 mos. KSJ, 2 May 1861, p. 4.

BULLENE, Joseph, son of Lanthrop and Susan F. Bullene, died Sunday morning 14th inst. Age 5 weeks. KSJ, 18 Jun 1863, p. 3.

BURDEN, Mr. Ester Ann, 21 yrs, 8 days, daughter of B. Hornsby, a refugee from MO. now residing in this place and the sixth child of that family that has died within three years, all of consumption. Leaves husband and two small children. LR, 10 Apr 1862, p. 3.

BURGESS, Osman Stone, 3 yrs, 1 mo., only son of Henry A. and Julia E. Burgess, died in DeSoto, Johnson Co., KS, 19 Sep of congestion of lungs. LR, 9 Oct 1862, p. 3.

BYLER, A.S., old citizen of Shawnee Co., thrown from his buggy between Tecumseh Topeka one day last week, died three days later. KSJ, 26, Jun 1862, p. 3.

CANIFF, Emeline, wife of Dr. H. J. Caniff, died on Wed. afternoon, 12th inst. of pulmonary consumption. LR, 13 Jun 1861, p. 3. Also, KSJ, 13 Jun 1861, p. 3-"funeral service, Methodist church, four o'clock by Revs. Fisher and Reynolds."

CARROLL, William, died intestate in Douglas Co. 24 Jul 1863, leaving no heirs. Was 5'8", slight built, 48 years old. Estate approximately \$216. (Notice for Heirs). KSJ, 30 Jul 1863, p. 3.

CHAPMAN, "Hair lip" \_\_\_\_\_, prominent from Free-State Times, killed a year or more ago at Council Bluffs, shot in an affray with a soldier (over wife). Had resided in Lawrence in log house on Lane and Jenkins claim. KSJ, 6 Jan 1863.

CATOR, William R., Administration notice of decease. KSJ, 13 Aug 1863, p. 3.

CLARK, Capt. John R., of Co. B, 5th KS Cal. killed at house of Mrs. Willis, Springfield, MO. (no date given), born Scioto Co., OH 1821. Emigrated to IN until 1836, then moved to Grundy Co., MO, served in Mexican War, 1 yr. as Private, after war married a niece of Col. Kit Carson, moved to Mercer Co. and went into mercantile business. Twice elected sheriff of Mercer, Delegate to Democrat State Convention. (From Springfield Missourian). KSJ, 12 Jun 1862, p. 1.

CLEVELAND, \_\_\_\_\_, killed near Ossawatomi by soldier of KS 6th, morning of 11th inst., buried Monday. LR, 14 May 1862, p. 3. Also, KSJ, 22 May 1862, p. 2. "shot by John T. Johnson of Co. "C", KS 6th."

COOVER, \_\_\_\_\_, killed by one of the scouts in Olathe near KS City, Wed. last LR 7 Aug 1862, p. 3.

COPELAND, James M., recently from M'Camish, Johnson Co., killed battle at Morristown, LR, 26 Sep 1861, p. 2. Also, KSJ, 26 Sep 1861, p. 2, "From Topeka, killed instantly by a charge through his head two inches wide." (From letter from camp near West Point, MO.)

COTT, Mrs. Stephen, died two or three nights since, suddenly in sleep. From Crusader, KSJ, 16 Apr 1863, p. 3.

COULTER, Willie J., 5 mos. 15 d., youngest child of J.S. and Cordelia K. Coulter, died in Lawrence, on Sunday evening 14th inst. of diphtheria. LR, 18 Sep 1862, p. 3.

CRUMPTON, Mrs. Frances E., 20 yrs., 7 mos., 2 days, wife of John W. Crumpton, died in Lawrence, 3 Jan 1862. Formerly of Warren Co., IN, leaves infant son, Warren, IN Republican, please copy. LR, 9 Jan 1862, p. 3. Also, KSJ, 9 Jan 1862, p. 3 includes poem.

CRUMPTON, John, died in this city on 11th inst. of consumption. Warren Co., IN papers please copy. LR, 17 Apr 1862, p. 3.

CUSH, Philip, murdered near Council Grove about two weeks ago by John Ward. LR, 26 Jaun 1862, p. 3.

DAVIDSON, Jordan, late of Douglas county. Final Estate Notice, Admisitrator, James A. Davidson. KSJ, 11 June 1863, p. 3.

DAWSON, child of Daniel Dawson, about two years old, died two miles East of Topeka. Suffocated in mud-puddle in the yard. KSJ, 25 Sep 1862, p. 3.

DEVAN, \_\_\_\_\_, son of Mr. Devan of Dickinson Co. Burned in prairie fire while hunting on Monday night. KSJ, Thurs. 7 Nov 1861, p. 3.

DINSMOOR, Ann Elizabeth, 13 yrs, 6 mos., only daughter of William A. and Mary Ann Dinsmoor, died in Eudora township, 17 Mar of congestive fever. LR 27 Mar 1862, p. 3.

DIXON, Jack, hung with Stephen Branch while prisoner at encampment of Crossing of Big Blue River about four miles above Manhattan. From Manhattan Express, 4th inst. KSJ, 16 Oct 1862, p. 1.

Roll of Eighth Grade Pupils Who Will Enter High School Largest in History.

Merwin Promotes 96

The Four Honor Students in the Class Are All Girls--A "Last Day" Program Given This Afternoon.

The largest freshman class which has ever entered the high school will be promoted from the grammar grades today. Prof. C. E. Merwin will send a class of ninety-six from Central school to the high school building with the close of the second semester's work this afternoon. This is the largest eighth grade in the history of the Lawrence schools.

The race suicide in the University town to which the school enumerator has attributed the persistent decrease in the census enumerations for three or four years, has apparently not affected the numerical strength of the higher classes. It is reducing the number of pupils in the primary grades but the grammar and high school registration continues to grow.

In Central building "last day" exercises were held this afternoon. The annual visit was paid the building by members from the G.A.R. post, who made the Memorial day addresses and retold the story of the great national struggle of the sixties. The scholastic honors are held entirely by the girls in this year's list of graduates, not a single boy coming within the prescribed average which designates an honor student.

JOHN HARRELL

John HARRELL, 91-year-old member of the Washington post of G.A.R., Civil War veteran and Indian fighter, died early today at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Earl HOBBS, in Lawrence.

Mr. HARRELL had been seriously ill since August 20.

With the death of Mr. HARRELL only two members of the Washington Post are living, and only one resides in Lawrence. They are S.K. FUNK of Lawrence and Henry J. GREEN of Eugene, Ore.

Born in Fayetteville, Ark. February 10, 1845, John HARRELL moved with his parents, Catherine and John H. HARRELL to Bloomington, Kansas, and a short time later, when he was 10 years old, they settled on a farm near Clinton.

Here he grew to manhood and later bought a farm of his own near Clinton.

On August 2, 1871, he married Catherine V. ANDERSON at Lawrence and they lived near Clinton until 14 years ago when they came to Lawrence to live with their daughter.

John HARRELL enlisted in the Third Kansas Cavalry in July, 1861, but the unit was not called into service and he was dismissed in October of that year.

His career as an Indian fighter after the Civil War began when he enlisted in Company A, 18th Regiment of Kansas Cavalry Volunteers on July 8, 1867 at Fort Harker, Kansas.

He saw service in the west and was wounded in battle. He was discharged November 15, 1867. The Eighteenth Regiment, a battalion of four companies was mustered into the United States service during July, 1867 to protect the western settlements, to guard employes of the Union Pacific railroad, and the travels on the highways leading to the West and southwest. It was commanded by Major H.L. MOORE of Lawrence. After fighting in the west, Mr. HARRELL returned to Clinton.

His wife past away in 1923. He is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Earl HOBBS of Lawrence, Mrs. Martin TARPY, of Clinton and Mrs. J.B. DAILEY of Lawrence; two sons Ray HARRELL of Clinton and Charles HARRELL of Lawrence; one sister Mrs. Mary WELCH of Sedan; one brother, B.D. HARRELL of Clinton, 11 grandchildren, and 25 great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held from the Clinton Presbyterian church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock with the Rev. Mr. WARD in charge. Burial will be at the Clinton Cemetery.

Spanish American War veterans acting for the G.A.R., will have charge of the military services at the grave.

EUDORA

A correspondent of the Topeka Capital gives the following interesting facts about our flourishing little neighbor at the mouth of the Wakarusa:

This place is situated at the mouth of the Wakarusa river, seven miles east of Lawrence, on the line of the A.T. & S.F.R.R., in Douglas county. This place was laid out about five years ago by a German company from Chicago, Illinois. It has a special charter as a city, granted by the Territorial Legislature, under which, it has acted ever since. It elects its mayor, council, marshal and other officers annually on the first Monday in March.

The city covers 840 acres of land, and has a population of about 800, principally Germans. We have five churches, two school houses, a flourishing mill and elevator; three general stores, besides two or three grocery stores, two drug stores, two hardware and tin shops, three hotels, a lumber yard, two harness shops, an Odd Fellows' building, temperance tabernacle, city hall, three cabinet shops, two boot and shoe shops, two wagon shops, three blacksmith shops, carpenter shops, restaurants, barber shop, three lodges of Odd Fellows and Masons, two or three doctors, and about the same number of lawyers.

There is considerable improvement being made for this season of the year. Several good dwellings are being built and others repaired. Our brick schoolhouse is nearly completed and ready for use. The old school building is too small to accommodate the scholars of the place. We have an excellent school this winter under the management of Prof. J.C. BANTA, as principal, and Miss FARR and Miss RAYSON assistants.

The German Episcopal Methodists have built them a very fine church this season at a cost of about \$3,000, which is a valuable improvement to the place and speaks well for the congregation, it being small in number. Rev. Daniel WALTER, their pastor, is entitled to great credit for his untiring efforts and zeal in behalf of his church. They are now holding protracted meetings and are having quite a revival.

There is considerable property changing hands, both in the town and surrounding country, at good prices. Every building in the place is occupied and rents are high.

Although crops were short, farmers say they realize about as much money for their produce as they usually do other years. Wheat never looked better at this season of the year. There was a greater acreage of wheat sown last fall than any previous year in this section of the country.

The prohibitory law is pretty generally observed here. There is but one place that the law is openly violated, and there it is said that they sell beer only. Prosecutions have already been instituted, and more will be, to abate the nuisance and punish the offender, and there is but little doubt that the guilty party will have to atone to the offended law and close up shop.

As I Knew Them:

EARLY SETTLERS of GRANT TOWNSHIP

"After Quantrill burned the Morgan home in Lawrence, Mr. Morgan bought some hills that were covered with Jack Oak trees and had springs in the foot hills. This farm was in the northeast part of Grant Township, near the Leavenworth County line. He built his house between two springs. The house was made mostly of native lumber, Walnut Clapboards, Hackberry floors, and a large fireplace in the long kitchen. This house was built by Horace Hancock, an early day carpenter in Lawrence.

In the spring of 1864 we left the place where father had built his cabin home just ten years before. I remember the round stone barn that was near our house, it was perfectly round, was built for dairy purposes. Some one has said it was an octagon but that is a mistake. The new owner might have changed it to an octagon after we left it, but not before. We crossed the river on a ferry boat, as at that time there was no bridge across the river. We went through the timber in North Lawrence, came out in the clear at the edge of Bismarck Grove.

There were some shanties at the edge of the grove, where colored people lived. These shanties were the only signs of habitation that we could see. We angled across the country, a little more north than east. There were no roads to help our progress nor fences to hinder us. We passed through two sloughs and came out on higher ground just south of Mud Creek. This land was still Indian land. Some of this ground had been stirred up in places; this was where the railroad had evidently been surveyed. It was to go across the Robinson farm in a northwest, more west than north, course. The railroad later changed plans and went through Lawrence. We finally reached the ford across Mud Creek which father had made. We crossed over and were on our ground.

The house was not quite ready for us so mother, brother, J.F. and myself went to the J.P. Whitney home to stay a few days. The Whitney home was about one half mile from our house. It did not take us long to get settled in our home as much of our worldly goods had burned with our house. A few necessities were added as we needed them. I remember the first coal oil lamp father brought home, it was a real thrill for us. It was a tall slim lamp, a pretty green base tapering up to the bowl which held about on-half pint of oil. We still used some candles. Mother made our candles for a long time, but now we could buy them at the grocery store. Our pioneer days were over...

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"In the early 60's, and before Quantrill's raid, David Miller settled on Mud Creek near the Leavenworth County line, just south of the J.P. Whitney home. Miller evidently bought his land from the Indians. There have been several generations of Millers on this same farm, and their children have attended Oakridge School.

Just west and joining the Miller farm is the farm William Stiner bought from the Indians in the early 60's. William, the youngest son of the Stiners is still living there. The Stiner farm is joined on the west by the southeast part of the Robinson section. In this corner of the Robinson farm is a tenement house. The Eli Mercer family if the first family that I know of living there. They had several children in the school. The Mercer family lived in the district for many years, and on different farms. A number of families have lived in this same corner. For the last few years it has been the home of Will Hayden: and is known as Hayden's corner.

South of Hayden's corner, is 40 acres of land which was purchased by Edward W. Morgan in 1867. This land was part of the Jim Lane estate and was sold by Capt. Strong, agent. The south part of this 40 was slough. I remember helping my brothers plant sod corn in that slough in 1867. Mr. Morgan did not keep this land very long. The south part was sold to one party. The north part was later sold to Scott Wood. Some of the Wood heirs still live on the place.

West of [the] Charlie Wood home is the farm where Joseph E. Garrett settled in the 60's. The Stiners and Garretts were related. The Garretts had two boys, the youngest boy, Ed Garrett lives on the place.

West of the Garrett farm is the Ed. Pine place. The Pines are old settlers of the community north of Lawrence."

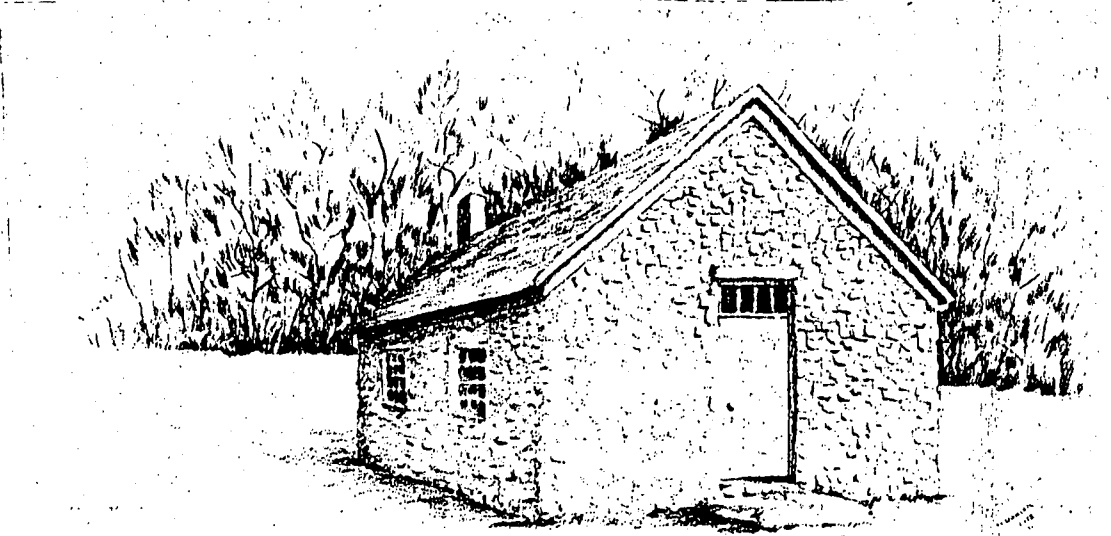
From Lecompton

ROCK CREEK DIST. NO. 13

This district acquired its site April 30, 1866, when John Hogan gave a deed to Samuel Lockhart, A. J. Haskin and J. T. Bachelor as District Board of District No. 13, for an irregular piece of land in the Northwest corner of the S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 8, T. 14, R. 18, containing one acre more or less.

Here a stone schoolhouse about 15 by 27 feet was built and continued in use with only minor changes or additions for the entire life of the district. It had a small belfry which was later removed and the bell sold to Jesse Sutton who still has it in his possession. At some time a cloak-room was added to the north of the entrance door, but otherwise it remained with its exterior just as it was originally built. The stone chimney was erected at the back end and from the ground, on the outside of the building. The walls are about two feet thick and the twelve-foot ceiling arches above the living-room of the present owners. It had only two windows on each side and a single solid door in the front with transom above for ventilation, and a large rock for a stoop below it. Inside were three rows of desks; double ones in the center and single ones along the outsides.

The first available records revealed a contract dated Aug. 2, 1897, between Lizzie Postma and J. H. Bachelor director, and Fred Webber clerk, of District No. 13, retaining Miss Postma as teacher for the six-months' term to begin Oct. 4, with a salary of \$30.00 per month.

It appears from the clerk's report at the end of the term in 1898, that there were 25 pupils, but he listed only 17 as of school age on the school census. This could mean any one of several different things: one, that there were at least 8 of school age whose names he failed to obtain; two, that he had transposed the figures "17" and "25"; and three, that there were 8 above school age who attended school. Which is correct no one will probably ever know, but the writer is inclined toward number three as the solution.

The names given on the 1898 census are: Grace BACHELOR; Alma, Minnie Erna and Herman BEHRENS; Maud, Marion and Alvin BOND; Karl DAVIS; Oral and Russell HATCHER; Walter and Douglas JACKSON; Elliott MIFLIN; Roy TUTTLE; Payton and Max WATTS. Total expenditure for the term was \$228.24.

Lizzie Postma also taught the terms 1898-99 and 1899-1900, followed by Mrs. Herrington, Clara Lutz, Nellie De Hek, Lizzie Postma (4 terms — not consecutive), Mary Tucker, Bessie Richardson, Lena Terrell, Lenah Butterfield and Ida Martin for the term ending in 1910 with board members Wm. Atchison, Mrs. Lizzie Watts and H. A. McKenzie.

The next decade had teachers Ellen Melville, Laura Watts, Vivian Cox, Gladys Waters, Ollie Ryan, Anna M. Ingle, Gretchen McCall and Maud Fawl who taught the term ending in 1920, with board members Chas. Bachelor, George L. Simmons and Mrs. H. A. McKenzie.

The 1920's had teachers Lillian Overbaugh, Blanche Skinner, Hilda Matthews, Hilda Vernon, Olive A. Brown and Marian Grist who taught the term ending in 1930. Board members of that date were August Shelbar, Mrs. D.C. Lamb and Robert Pardee. The enrollment was 12, teacher's salary \$95.00 per month and total operating expense for the term \$700.89.

During the years 1927-29 a new access road to Rock Creek School was built from the north. This came about largely through the efforts of the teacher Olive Brown, who brought the poor condition of the south road and its effect on school attendance to the attention of the county commissioners.

Teachers of the 1930's were Mary Adelia Ross, Lorraine McCall, Margaret Roper, Elizabeth Hoffman, Letha Dillon, Catherine Jardon, and Ruth Bertschinger for the term ending in 1940, with board members Mrs. Ira Moore, Robert Pardee and Herman B. Schellhorn.

The 1940's began with teacher Evelyn Faye Latas followed by W. L. Woolhouse (5 mo.) and Mrs. Ruth Jones (3 mo.), Mrs. Maud Gall for one term and 15 wks. of the second term which was finished by Mrs. Chas. Woodward, and Betty Warren for the term ending in 1945. Board members were Homer Moss, Robert Pardee and Joe Crane.

This last term had only 6 pupils and the operating expense was \$1049.52. In what would have been the next term, there were only 3 of school age in the entire district, so the school was closed and never re-opened. In 1949, the district was disorganized and became part of Districts 4, 32, 36 and 41. Whatever funds were then in the hands of the county treasurer belonging to Rock Creek, were apportioned to these districts according to the respective ad valorem valuations: District No. 4 received 26 percent, No. 32, 10 percent, No. 36, 34 percent, and No. 41, 30 percent.

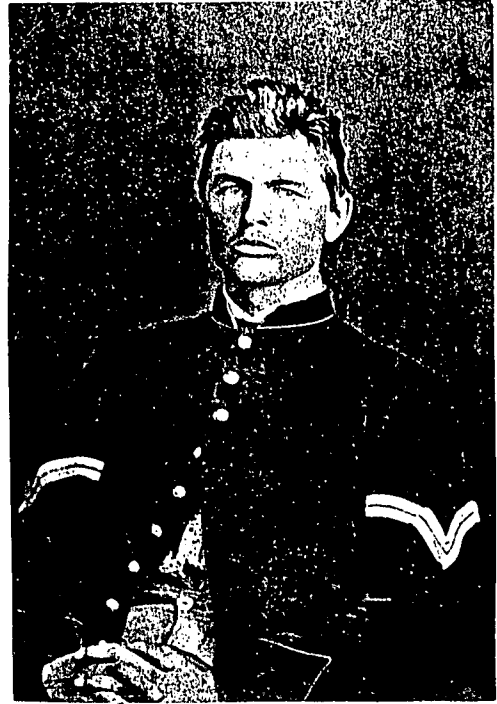

Henry W. EGGERT'sLetterto His Children

Henry W. EGGERT, an early settler near the now extinct town of Franklin in Wakarusa township, Douglas County, wrote several narratives about his life. These include a "Genealogy," "Early Times in Kansas," "G.A.R.-Fraternal Order," A list of neighbors, a note about church affiliation and a "Letter to My Children." These items may be seen in the Kansas Collection University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas. Also included in the EGGERT file are photographs of Henry EGGERT and his relatives, a copy of his will and an inventory of his Estate (dated 1928).



Lawrence, Kansas  
April 18, 1918.

"To my children and Whom it may concern:

I, Henry W. EGGERT, was born in Milwaukee County, Wisconsin on April 18, 1841. My parents<sup>1</sup> removed to Stephenson County, Illinois about 1847, and in April of 1856 they moved to Douglas County, Kansas and settled near the town of Franklin, four miles south-east of Lawrence. On August 15th, 1862, I enlisted in Co. "B", 12 Kansas Inf. and served with the regiment to the close of the War as private and corporel; took part in all the battles and skirmishes, the Regiment was engaged in; was discharged from the service on June 30th, 1865 at Little Rock, Arkansas at the closing of the War. Returned to my old home and commenced farming.

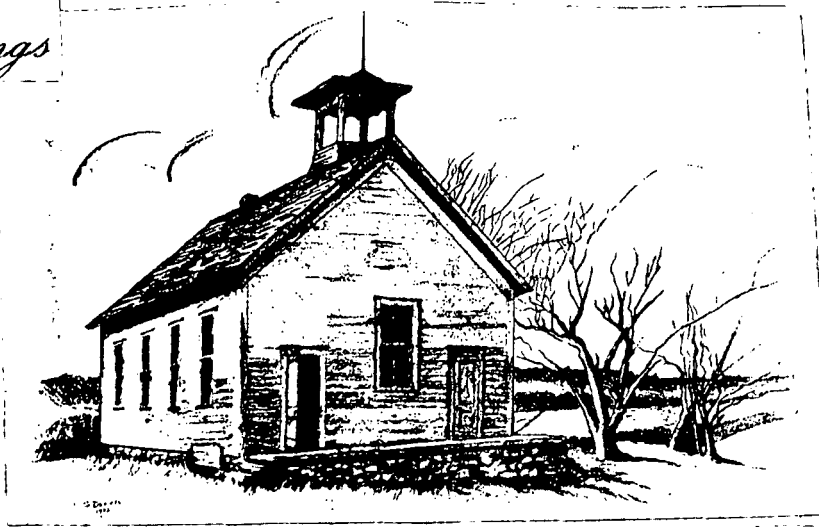
I was married on the 17th day of October 1867 to Miss Martha FITTON.<sup>2</sup> Our union was a happy one, and four children were born to us, James Henry, Nettie W., Frederick W. and Arthur. My beloved wife died on January 1st, 1904, and on the 15th day of April 1908 I was married to Ida Mae WELCH of Lawrence, Kansas. Our life is a very pleasant one. She is a pleasant and lovable companion and we are very happy.

Though some kind of school may have existed here at an earlier date, a building site was acquired September 1, 1871 from Stephen and Susannah STUDEBAKER. The first board was Thomas WARNE, Jacob MURPHY and Edward JONES. The school was named Rocky Mountain School, District No. 67. This small frame building served the district until about 1893. The first teacher was J.D. PORTER and was paid \$40.00 per month. Other teachers until 1893 were Ella FLINN, Wm. GALLION, M.E. SMITH, J.H. CARRUTH, James MARCKLEY, James B. OWENS, C. REYNOLDS, Laura ANDERSON, Laura GEIGER, Dora E. PEER, Miss FITZ, Linnie KENNEDY, A. BECK, Maud GEIGER, Lizzie KERNS, Maggie GREGORY, and Mary REYNOLDS.

Salaries ranged from \$30.00 to \$40.00 per month. An item on the books reads, "to Sarah FUSSELL for boarding teacher...\$10.00," indicates that the teachers "board was paid by the district in addition to the salary.

In 1893, George and Dora MARKLEY sold the district a parcel of land about 1/2 mile west of the original site. The old building was moved to the George MARKLEY farm by horses where it became a part of his house, still with belfry and bell on top. The property is now the William RICE farm where the house stands.

Since the district was to have a new schoolhouse in a new location, it was decided to give it a new name also. Columbia was chosen since 1892 was the four hundredth anniversary of the discovery of America by COLUMBUS.

The new building was larger than the old one. The belfry was not added until 1913. Myra FITZ was the first teacher in the new building.

Others until 1900 were Ella HAMMOND, Mabel GRAHAM, Eva BATES, Arthur BRIDWELL, D.F. SMITH, Artis METSKER.

Board members were G.W. MARKLEY, H.B. SANDERS, and A. BROHAMMER.

Those of school age at this time were: Rosa BROHAMMER; Vina CHURCHBAUGH; Henry and Walter DEARDORFF; Alva, Maude, Iva and Frederick FLORY; Hazel and Winea JONES; Oscar, Etta, Jessie and Robert MARKLEY; Mary, Ida and Noah MINNIX; Tillie, Viola, Julia, Priscilla and Lester NAY; Hattie, Vina, and Edward SANDERS; Samuel, Maggie and Mabel SHOEMAKER; Rachel, Margery, and Laura WATTS; Floyd WELLS.

Teachers from 1900 to 1910 were Rella HOUDYSHEL, Minnie KENNEDY, again Artis METSKER, Alice HAMMOND, Nannie CLEVELAND, Rose NEAL, Ella WHITE, Alice HYATT and E.G. SMITH. School board members were: Wm. CHURCHBAUGH, J.L. JONES and A. BROHAMMER.

## Columbia School continued

From 1910 until 1920 teachers were: Nellie LEWIS, Lanzell CORCORAN, Sarah NOWAK, Emma DEWS, Etta MEINKE, Ellen MELVILLE, Alice McGUFFEY, Elfreda SELZER, Loree AVERILL, and Irene CREEL. Board members were: Edward SANDERS, J.E. MARKLEY and Charles BROHAMMER.

The 1920's teachers were Dollye E. WARD, Margaret WILSON, Mabel A. ANDERSON, Mary SANDERS, Lottie ANDERSON, Lottie THURBER, and Agnes STEVENS. Board members were: S.J. MARKLEY, E.H. SANDERS, and Charles BROHAMMER.

The 1930's continued with Grace Agnes STEVENS, Sylvia SHULER, Vera WARD, Lillian ROBBINS and Freida ROTHCHILD. Board members were S.J. MARKLEY, Mrs. John BROHAMMER and Charles BROHAMMER.

The 1940's began with Freida ROTHCHILD, Doris WEIBLE, Florence L. GUGIN, Blake D. MILLER. In 1948 the district was disorganized and the property attached to districts 38, 47 and 51 under the direction of County Superintendent Margaret HURLEY. The schoolhouse was sold and dismantled.

The school district held literary society meetings for its young people. It had a constitution but no name. A meeting was scheduled on January 2, 1894 to fully organize the society.
